1. Mr Mac Maharaj joined the meeting to briefly discuss the issues which this Committee should address, the main items being which basic rights should be guaranteed in the Transition Period.

4. Categories of Fundamental Rights

- 4.1. It was agreed that the basic Fundamental Rights could be addressed in four categories:

 - 4.1.2. Desirable rights.
 - 4.1.3. Rights in respect of debates and disputes.
 - 4.1.4. Rights which ought not to be in the Interim Constitution.

4.2. The **members present agreed** that documentation would be obtained on fundamental rights, and each member to study these in preparation for the First Interim Report. - 5.2. Hugh Corder submitted "A Charter for Social Justice" published by the Department of Law, University of Cape Town, December 1992. He is one of the contributors to this publication.
- 5.3. Sibongile Nene said that there were three Bills dealing with Women's Rights and she would request documentation from the relevant Women's Groups.
