MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE NEGOTIATING COUNCIL HELD AT 19H30 ON THURSDAY 27 MAY 1993 AT THE WORLD TRADE CENTRE

PRESENT: See Addendum A

1. Moment of Prayer/Meditation

A moment of prayer/meditation was observed by all members.

2. Welcome and Attendance

- 2.1 The participants were welcomed.
- 2.2 An appeal was made from the Chair for all participants to conduct the debate and discussion with the dignity, responsibility and reasonability befitting the Negotiating Council. This would ensure that the negotiating process remained constructive.
- 2.3 It was agreed that one participant from each delegation be afforded the opportunity to speak, limiting their input to five minutes. This did not apply to Mr Kriel from the SA Government delegation who would be presenting the facts from the side of the SA Government. After this input, questions of clarity would be allowed, following which would be an opportunity for debate and discussion.

3. Ratification of the Agenda

The agenda was ratified with no amendments.

4. The Events Around the Arrests of PAC Members

- 4.1 A statement by the Mr Kriel was made.
- 4.2 Questions of clarity followed.
- 4.3 Discussion and debate followed.

- 4.4 The PAC requested a further opportunity to address the meeting. This was agreed to.
 - 4.5 After further discussion and the expressing of various views and proposals, it was agreed that the meeting adjourn to allow the Planning Committee to take the issue further and propose a way forward.

The meeting adjourned at 23h00.

The meeting reconvened at 00h15.

- 4.6 The Planning Committee proposed a draft resolution for consideration by the Negotiating Council (see Addendum B).
- 4.7 It was agreed to adopt the resolution as is. In this regard the following concerns to be addressed in the bilateral between the PAC and the SA Government on Friday 28 May 1993 were noted:
 - 4.7.1 From the side of the PAC:
 - * That those members who have been arrested and not charged, be released immediately;
 - * That equipment and goods confiscated and not needed for prosecution actions, be returned as soon as possible.
 - 4.7.2 From the side of the SA Government:
 - * That the PAC's continuous commitment to violence and their lack of compliance with the resolutions of the Negotiating Forum of 1 April 1993 and any other resolutions on violence passed by the Negotiating Council be addressed immediately.
- 4.8 It was noted that the AVU and the KP objected to the resolution.

5. Closure

The meeting was closed at 00h40.
