OPENING

1.1 The meeting was opened by Sen. Radue at 20h45.

2. MINUTES

2.1 The minutes of the Core Group meeting of 27 March were adopted without corrections.

3. MATTERS ARISING

- 3.1 The following matters arising were noted:
 - 3.1.1 Media Advertisement on Block 3
 - i) The Group was informed that the advertertisement had been finalised and would appear in the newspapers the coming week.

3.1.2 Oral hearings

- memorandum from the CA Executive Director informing members about a proposed structure for a hearing with the business sector was tabled.
- ii) A draft programme for a Conference on the Participation of Youth in the Writing of the New Constitution facilitated by the HSRC for Theme Committee 4 was tabled.

The Group expressed concern regarding the Conference on the Participation of Youth, noting that the HSRC had no mandate to organise a conference on behalf of the Theme Committee and that the Committee had not been consulted on this matter. Concern was also raised on the possibility that the programme may have been circulated in the Theme Committee's name. It was agreed that the Secretariat communicate these concerns to the HSRC most urgently. The Group did not however have any principled objections to the objectives and proposed content of the conference, and agreed to place the issue on the agenda of the next Theme Committee meeting.

3.1.3 The Management Committee document of 23 March 1995, entitled "Chairpersons Report and Evaluation of Process" was tabled, and paragraphs 4.2 and 4.3 were noted for the attention of the Technical Committee.

4. BLOCK 2: WORK SCHEDULE

4.1 It was agreed that no discussion on this agenda item was required as the matter was covered in the Theme Committee meeting.

5. GENERAL

5.1 It was agreed that the Drafting Sub-Group would have to meet to finalise the Committee's reports on: i) Nature and Application of Bill of Rights; ii) Right to Privacy; and Right to Human Dignity.
