

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

I am currently trying to alter the schedule of Professors Alan Tarr and Ellis Katz to enable them to have four full days in Cape Town to meet with members, staff, and experts from the Constitutional Assembly and the Theme Committees.

I read in an article in the <u>Mail & Guardian</u> that a major all-day Constitutional Committee meeting will be held next Friday to debate federal issues.
