



POSSIBLE TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR A SUBCOUNCIL ON LOCAL GOVERNMENT.

One has to consider developments from the Local Government Negotiating Forum (LGNF) when giving content to the terms of reference of a possible Subcouncil for Local Government.

It follows naturally that the Subcouncil as a satellite of the TEC, may have limited powers of execution but will mainly give feedback to the TEC. Bearing this in mind the following terms of reference are proposed:

- Recommend the amendment, replacement or repeal of discriminatory or inhibiting legislation.
- Facilitate the implementation of broad principles on an electoral system for local government, which will enjoy general support.
- 3. Facilitate the process of informing the electorate and politicians at local level regarding the purpose of local government elections and their rights, responsibilities and obligations.
- 4. Formulate measures to promote a climate for free political participation and the conducting of free and fair elections at local level.
- 5. Formulate measures to curb intimidation at local level.
- 6. Conduct surveys to assess the degree of levelling the playing field as far as free political participation and the conducting of free and fair elections at local level, are concerned.
- 7. Advise the TEC on the levelling of the playing field as far as free political participation and free and



fair elections at local level, are concerned.

- 8. Interlink the activities of bodies such as the LGNF, Housing Forum and Electricity Forum with the activities of the TEC.
- 9. Establish regional monitoring committees of the Subcouncil to monitor local negotiations and the implementation of transitional measures for local government.
 - As far as the establishment of regional monitoring committees is concerned, the question of interlinking activities of bodies such as mentioned in paragraph 8 above and certain practical and logistical problems that may be experienced, the following will have to be taken into consideration.
 - Elections will take place in more than 500 local government areas in the four Provinces.
 - To expect of 1 Sub-council to level the playing field is impossible
 - Consideration should thus be given to establish more than one regional monitoring committee. Regional monitoring committees for the following areas could be considered:

 The position of the self governing territories and the TBVC-States will



also have to be taken into account.

- As far as interlinking/interaction is concerned, the regional monitoring committees could be rasponsible to the Sub-Council and the latter could interact with institutions/organisations such as:
 - The TEC
 - Local Government Negotiating Forum
 - Provincial Governments
 - Electification Forum
 - Peace Secretariat
 - Demarcations Boards or Commissions
 - Election Commission
- 9.3 As far as the terms of reference for the regional monitoring committees is concerned, the following could be considered:
 - (i) Recommend the amendment, replacement or repeal of discriminatory or inhibiting legislation.
 - (ii) Facilitate the implementation of broad principles on an electoral system for local government, which will enjoy general support.
 - (iii) Facilitate the process of informing the electorate and politicians at local level regarding the purpose of local government elections and their rights, responsibilities and obligations.
 - (iv) Recommend measures to promote a climate for free political participation and the conducting of free and fair elections at



local level.

- (v) Monitor measures to curb intimidation at local level.
- (vi) Conduct surveys to assess the degree of levelling the playing field as far as free political participation and the conducting of free and fair elections at local level, are concerned.
- (vii) Advise the Sub-Council on the levelling of the playing field as far as free political participation and free and fair elections at local level, are concerned.
- (viii) Interlink the activities of bodies such as local negotiating forums with the Sub-Council and the Local Government Negotiating Forum.
- (ix) Monitor local negotiations and the implementation of transitional measures for local government.
