- 2.1 B Holomisa of the Transkei requested that Z Titus be allowed as a substitute delegate for the Transkei with the Facilitating Committee. This was accepted.
- 2.2 It was agreed that substitutes will be allowed for Facilitating Committee meetings. A request for continuity was made to all.
- 2.3 It was noted that the person representing a delegation within the Facilitating Committee has the authority to deal with the matters arising.
- 2.4 It was agreed that no substitutes will be accepted at any sub-committees that may be formed by Facilitating Committee.
- 2.5 A proposal was made that the Facilitating Committee should consist of one delegate and one adviser was made. A decision was not made.
- 2.6 It was agreed that the Facilitating Committee has the responsibility to plan, organise for and to implement the necessary steps to give effect to the resolutions adopted by the Planning Conference.

3. Multi-Party Forum

- 3.1 In terms of the resolution on "The Need for the Resumption/Commencement of Multi-Party Negotiations" as adopted by the Multi-Party Planning Conference, it was proposed that the Multi-Party Forum be convened on 1 and 2 April 1993.
- 3.2 This proposal was adopted by the meeting.
- 3.3 It was noted that the IFP is of the view that given the amount of preparatory

work that is needed in respect of the convening of the Multi-Party Forum, the dates of 1 and 2 April is premature. It was further noted that in spite of this view, the IFP would nevertheless form part of the consensus decision of the meeting in this regard.

- 3.4 It was noted that in terms of paragraph 3 of the above resolution, the composition of the Multi-Party Forum would be 2 delegates and 2 advisers per party/organisation/administration.



1. Opening and Welcome

The chairperson opened the meeting at 09h00.

2. Presentation of Resolutions

- 2.1 Draft Resolutions on The Need for the Resumption/Commencement of Multi-party Negotiations and the Process of Decision-making in the Planning Conference were presented.
- 2.2 Amendments were made and the draft resolutions approved by the committee (see Addendums B, C and D). T Langley recorded his dissent in this regard.
- 2.3. The committee noted that R Cronje did not have a problem with the wording "country" and a "new constitution". He agreed that a Multi-Party Conference has to draw up a constitution for South Africa and cannot do so for other states. In drawing up this constitution for South Africa, provision could be made for regional constitutions. If, as a result of negotiations, new states or regions are established, they will draw up their own constitutions.
- 2.4. It was also noted that 4.2 and 4.3 of the Resolution Number 2 (Addendum C) should be interpreted as not meaning that all agreements reached at CODESA are binding on the multi-party forum that will convene by 5 April 1993.
- 2.5 A draft resolution on violence was presented to the committee and approved without amendments.


