

Van Rooyen: Trio point out burial site

IOHANNESBURG: The search for five missing girls in Gert van Rooyen's former home took a dramatic turn yesterday when three people, who had stayed on the paedophile's property, independently pointed to the same spot in the main bedroom and said "a body was buried" there.

The three — who were among four people who came forward to say they had information that might help the police — also identified a section of the passage where they said they had seen "an entrance to a cellar"

As their search warrant allowed them to look only for a cellar and not for bodies, police investigators applied late yesterday afternoon for its terms to be extended.

SA Police Services Director Reggie Marimuthu said a thorough search under the floor of the main bedroom would begin today. The search would also concentrate on the area in the passage that the informers had said led to an underground cavity.

Police refused to say which of the four informants had given corroborating leads.

The first of the four to enter the house was an estate agent who told police he had been asked by Van Rooyen to sell the property about 17 years ago. He recalled there was a cellar somewhere at the back of the house.

The second visitor was "Baby" Koen whom police spokesman Captain Dave Harrington said had been a fellow prisoner when Van Rooyen served a sentence about 20 years ago for two counts of child molestation. He had boarded with Van Rooyen after his first discharge.

Koen, now serving a life term for a muti murder, was flanked by members of the Child Protection Unit and Zonderwater Prison warders when he entered the house.

The other two informants are Sanet, Van Rooyen's former daughter-in-law, and a domestic worker who had been employed by Van Rooyen and whose name was not given.

Sanet, who was fetched by an investigating officer from the Free State, and her then-husband, Gerhard van Rooyen, had shared the house with the elder Van Rooyen's ex-wife, Aletta, after the paedophile and his mistress, Joey Haarhoff, committed suicide in 1990.

It was Gerhard who brought a halt to police excavations at the house six years ago when he obtained a court order preventing further digging.

Investigators said the witnesses had given them "great optimism" after a second sniffer dog, brought in early yesterday, failed to confirm the findings made by the first on Monday. The first dog has isolated a section of the main bedroom and of the garage.

Harrington said a number of other people had come forward: "Every possibility will be exhausted.

CONSTITUTIONAL negotiators emerged smiling from 11th-hour talks last night and South Africa should have a new constitution today, BARRY STREEK reports.

ODAY is the historical date on which South Africa adopts its first democratic constitution, drawn up by a multiracial assembly. The chief negotiators — Mr Roelf Meyer of the National Party and the ANC's Mr Cyril Ramaphosa, who chairs the Constitutional Assembly, were highly optimistic after a day of talks to bridge their differences.

After weeks of wrangling, most political parties agreed to compromise proposals on the lockout, the property and education clauses in **DON'T MISS YOUR**

A visibly tired but elated Ramaphosa announced last night: 'We have reached a settlement on all these matters."

the Bill of Rights.

"We have a settlement — we have done it," an exhausted but enthusiastic Meyer said.

A last-minute hitch, what Ramaphosa called a "new matter" over pensions to political office-bearers, delayed agreement on the final deal for more than an hour. The problem concerned pension payments to apartheid-era politicians as well as special pensions for veterans of the anti-apartheid struggle.

One source said the NP had raised the issue late on Monday night during the negotiations for compromise on the three contentious clauses. "The NP has sold out their principles for gravy," he added.

Another parliamentarian said: "This is the beginning of the end for the NP.

But the problem was solved and shortly after midnight, negotiators ratified a number of amendments. The agreement paves the way for the adoption of

the constitution by a two-thirds majority, despite the Inkatha Freedom Party's boycott of the proceedings. The DP and Freedom Front would not declare their positions until they had seen the text of the agreements between the ANC and NP, but the PAC said it

would vote for the constitution. The agreement, which will rule out a referendum and even an election if the assembly had failed to adopt the constitution, involved a package deal between the ANC and NP on the three contentious clauses in the bill

The NP had been threatening to vote against the constitution, and possibly deny a two-thirds majority, unless the ANC agreed to a clause guaranteeing state support for single language schools. Last night, the constitutional committee

agreed to a DP amendment which "does not preclude state subsidies for independent or private schools". The compromise means single-medium schools will be an option the state will have to consider in determining education policy.

Cosatu secretary-general Mr Sam Shilowa, who attended last night's debate, said the controversial labour clause, which excludes a special right to lockout, meant there was "no need for further industrial action" in the immediate future.

He said that agreed provisions had been "a vindication of Cosatu's position", echoing the position of the DP leader Mr Tony Leon who described the clause as "an out and out victory for

Leon, who was jeered by ANC members who accused him of staging "a nice media stunt", said

the DP would take the clause to the Constitutional The compromise clause does not contain any

direct reference to lockouts, but only refers to existing labour legislation which provides employers with a right to lockout.

The property clause guarantees existing property rights as well as endorsing the government's power to proceed with land reform measures.

DP MPs last night accused the NP of selling out on the property clause to get a deal on education. Ms

Dene Smuts said property rights had been "eroded". The assembly also agreed to an amendment to the draft constitution which could entrench Cape Town's status as the legislative capital.

The amendment stipulates that the seat of Parliament is Cape Town and this cannot be changed unless the Council of Provinces, the new upper house,

determines that it should be elsewhere. This has to be approved by a majority of the National Assembly. The compromise was negotiated after President Nelson Mandela

said in Johannesburg yesterday morning that if the opposition parties did not agree to the draft constitution, the ANC would write the con-

stitution on its own. "I am confident we will be able to pass a constitution which has been agreed to by all parties.

"If not, it will be regrettable because the ANC will write its own constitution. We have a mandate to bring about change, transformation from an apartheid system to one that is fully democratic and legitimate. We cannot let our people down," Mandela said.

The IFP announced that it would challenge the new constitution before the Constitutional Court. Analysis of the bill showed that it breached a provision entrenched in the interim constitution that the new of provinces.

Mr Peter Smith, MP, said the IFP objected in particular to the weakness of the new Council of Provinces, and to the increased authority the constitution will give the national legislature.

However, Senator David Malatsi, deputy secretarygeneral of the NP, said: "I hope all of us are going to hold hands together today and vote for the constitu-

tion. I hope it will be adopted by consensus. "I hope today will be our day. All of us."

VOLUNTEERS BUILD CLINIC ON A DUMP

Fighting illness, poverty in Umtata Transkei roads

A SCOTS orthopaedic surgeon and his English wife, a nurse, are helping to combat illness and extreme poverty in the Transkei. **DIANE CASSERE** visited

THE McConnachies live in a cottage in the grounds of Umtata General Hospital, a haven from which they fight the twin enemies of illness and pover-

Dr Chris McConnachie is chairman of the African Medical Mission and of Vision Care, Professor of Orthopaedics at Transkei University, head of Orthopaedics at Umtata General Hospital and acting superintendent of Bedford Orthopaedic Hospital near Umtata. He also has a private practice.

Mrs Jenny McConnachie, a registered nurse, runs a clinic at a local refuse dump and manages a recreational workshop at the tuberculosis hospital, where long-term recovering patients learn skills such as shoe-making, sewing and woodwork.

They do this in a third-world situation where TB is rife, poverty is more the norm than the exception and cultural beliefs ensure the introduction of more and more babies into an indifferent world.

The clinic at Etipini Dump, run by Jenny McConnachie with Mrs Vicky Scott, is situated in a squatter camp of unbelievably squalid conditions, next to the Umtata River and on a refuse site where the inhabitants scavenge for a living of sorts. Two taps provide the only water and furrows of dirt and refuse run between the shacks. Children of all ages, all with running noses, are everywhere.

The two have succeeded in creating a pre-school, baby clinic and inoculation clinic out of corrugated iron, donated paint and two Safmarine containers. Scott first identified the need for the clinic and was joined by McConnachie. who helped to raise money and works there every weekday morn-

We visited the refuse dump on a Friday, and watched as crates of beer were brought into the settlement, anticipating the weekend: "Alcohol is a major problem here," said Jenny sadly

There has been a ray of hope recently for the Bedford Orthopaedic Hospital, which had been grinding to a halt for lack of facilities. The hospital serves over 5 million people and has now received a R2,3 million corporatesponsored medical complex, after a fundraising campaign initiated by President Nelson Mandela.

Four high-tech operating theatres and an intensive care unit have been funded by donations of R1,2 million and R1,1 million respectively from Engen Petroleum and Amplats and ICI Ltd.

Mandela officially opened the dren and three adopted, two of

complex last month.

Battles of all kinds, small and large, are being won by the McConnachies but there is still a long way to go. Their story started in 1967 when Chris, who had gone to America to further his medical studies, saw an ad for volunteers for the Society of the Propagation of the Gospel. The society paid their fares and they came out for the first time for 15 months in

"After that, I had a private practice in North Carolina where I was for 12 years, but we kept coming out as volunteers and were spending more and more time in Umtata," he explains.

In 1985, the couple decided to come out here full time. They have four biological chil-

them from Umtata — Michael, 15, and Bonga, 9.

Dr McConnachie's work is essentially orthopaedics: "There is a large incidence of tuberculosis of the spine and knee, not just the lungs. There is tremendous unemployment here, but we are seeing less TB and polio now than in the '60s. And people are better off than they were then."

However, the population has increased dramatically: "There were around half a million people in the Transkei at the turn of the century. Today there are more than 5 million.

The McConnachies together founded the African Medical Mission in 1981. It was created specifically to improve the quality of medical care for the underprivileged in what was then the homeland of Transkei.

The construction of the two theatres at Bedford Orthopaedic Centre was just one of the projects of the mission. It has also started a non-profit eye care centre, obtained sponsorship for five black South African doctors for overseas training and co-ordinated countless donations of medical equipment, among many other

Some on-going projects include the recruitment of professional medical volunteers to train and assist local health professionals, the supervision and funding of the Etipini Dump project, funding of a school and playroom for children undergoing TB treatment at Umtata General and sponsorship of medical professionals to confer-

IS IT SAFE to drive through the Transkei today, after the horror stories of the past? DIANE CASSERE went to find out.

ANNOUNCING that I was going to travel back to Cape Town from Durban through the Transkei was much like the Londoner saying that he was going to Wales for the weekend: It was met with complete disbelief.

Yes, there was a time when travelling through the former homeland was dangerous, but then travelling anywhere in South Africa, including to the Cape Town airport (then DF Malan) was lifethreatening. You just had to decide to go and take a chance or stay home in the laager.

For years I had taken the Bloemfontein, Winburg, Harrismith route to and from Natal on the grounds that it was much safer. Travellers through the Transkei told tales of being stopped by youths with AK47s, stone-throwings and murders.

Today the biggest danger in the Transkei is the livestock. Dead sheep, dogs and unidentified small carcasses streak the roads in various stages of mutilation and while hitting a dog might be a miserable experience, colliding with a cow or horse at speed would be a disaster.

There is also the human factor — the intersections in the Transkei make ideal meeting places, and often games take place, usually involving a stick and ball. Two minibuses will stop in the middle of nowhere while the drivers exchange information and small children dart in and out of the road at random.

Bicycles are popular, as are ponies, and watching out for both is another concern. In short, you can't go at any kind of speed because you are constantly on the look-out for living creatures.

Then there are the potholes, sometimes almost wide sinkholes in the road. Hitting one of those at speed can cause an accident — it would certainly damage your car. Those are the negatives - the

Transkei remains a beautiful route with wide, rolling hills that appear almost velvet under grass. While farming is rudimentary and land erosion spectacular, it has a gentle, rural appeal and the light on the hills can be beautiful.

We stopped at a sign not far out of Umtata that said "Collywobbles" and pointed left to nowhere. As we stepped out of the car, I momentarily wondered if it was a wise thing to do, but the ball players and a clutch of women gossiping at the roadside just carried on with what they were doing, pausing only to gaze at people photographing a road sign.

I had remembered Umtata as a small, pretty town with bougainvillaea everywhere and a busy commercial centre. Today it is untidy and dirty, with informal markets on the pavements and live chickens for sale everywhere.

There are roadworks between Butterworth and Umtata, indicating that at last, the roads will be improved.

Nearing East London, we passed the old Transkei border post which is now a tourist information centre for the Eastern Cape region. Dramatically, the road improved in the former "South African" side, but that was to be temporary: The road from East London to Grahamstown is narrow and not as good as other parts of the N2.

Travelling through the Transkei no longer appears dangerous, it is just tedious. Take cash with you because cheques and credit cards are useless.

Just a point of interest: Those of us who know Grahamstown during festival weeks will find it a ghost town outside the season. It was strange not to see tents on every bit of grassland, cars parked at impossible angles and the blue rinse brigade consulting their brochures. No gumbooted children sang Shosholoza and the stu-dents must have actually been attending lectures.

I parked directly outside the 1820 Settlers' Monument, just for the hell of it. The chance may

KESSEL FEINSTEIN 'COMPLIED WITH OBLIGATIONS'

Tollgate auditors hit back

THE AUDITING FIRM Kessel Feinstein said yesterday it was satisfied that it had complied with all its obligations regarding Tollgate. RONALD MORRIS reports.

ESSEL FEINSTEIN, the firm of auditors served with summons by Tollgate liquidators on Monday for R29 million in damages suffered by the collapsed company because they allegedly failed to fulfil their professional duties, hit back yesterday and vowed they would "vigorously defend the summons"

Mr Malcolm Segal, national chairman of Kessel Feinstein, said: "We are entirely satisfied we have complied with all our obligations and that we have a strong defence against each and every claim in the

"During the course of the Section 417 inquiry we made every effort to assist the liquidators until it became clear the process was being used as a basis to glean information on which to lodge a claim against our firm as opposed to the obtaining of information about the circumstances of the insolvency and the responsibilities of the directors."

Kessel Feinstein, therefore, ceased to assist in the inquiry, "a decision proven correct in retrospect as the envisaged summons has now been received".

Segal said rumours of a huge claim were continuously fanned in the business community and the company welcomed the fact that this had been brought to a head.

"This would appear to be another instance of what is happening increasingly worldwide, that is, the statutory auditors are seen to be the party of last resort by dissatisfied investors and creditors.

"This is the so-called 'deep pocket' syndrome.

"Statistics reflect that many claims fail. In those few cases that do succeed, the damages awarded are generally a small percentage of the original claim.

"The auditors' primary duty is to examine and report financial statements and it is the directors of

the company who are responsible for its assets and management.

"It appeared from the sequence of events and the timing of the media coverage that the summons was leaked to the media before it was served on Kessel Feinstein. The matter was sub-judice and the unlawful act of publicity raises many questions and would be investigated by the firm's lawyers and referred to the appropriate

'The company was 75 years old this year and had the resources to deal with the matter," Segal said.

Meanwhile, in a letter to the liquidators, Mr Richard Marcus, attorney for former Tollgate chairman Mr Hennie Diedericks, rejected allegations that his client had been guilty of misappropriating Tollgate funds as "factually incor-

rect, misleading and defamatory" Diedericks, who had resigned from Tollgate in March 1990, at no time had any dealings with Kessel Feinstein and had signed the last set of books in 1988.

The liquidators' actions in making the allegations was a "deliberate attempt to slur his reputation and is defamatory in the extreme"

He also did not regard it as coincidence that this misinformation, disclosed via the press, came the day before the Section 417 inquiry resumed at which Diedericks will give evidence.

Diedericks demanded an apology and a retraction of the allegations and warned he intended to sue the liquidators for "substantial

of the "Under-14 army" in Tumahole near Parys, that apparently had 1 500 members and was said to be responsible for razing the town hall in 1987.

Seipei could recite the Freedom Charter and long passages from the writings of Karl Marx. Then he moved to Soweto. Madikizela-Mandela was found guilty of being privy to Seipei's kidnapping and assault and sentenced to six years' imprisonment. On appeal the conviction was upheld, but the prison sentence was commuted to a R15 000 fine and a suspended two-year prison sentence.

One of her bodyguards, Jerry Richardson, was found guilty of the murder and is serving a life sentence.










18 govts to help upgrade teaching skills

AT A MEETING with teachers' representatives last night, President Nelson Mandela revealed his plan for retraining teachers. Education writer CAROL CAMPBELL reports.

IGHTEEN governments are to things take time. They do know help with a plan to upgrade the skills of South African teachers to enable them to be more versatile in the classroom, President Nelson Mandela said last

The main emphasis of teacher retraining would be in science and technology, but teachers would also be encouraged to learn more about other aspects of education, such as adult education or pre-primary schooling.

Speaking after a meeting with representatives of the South African Democratic Teachers' Union (Sadtu) and the National Professional Teachers' Organisation (Naptosa), Mandela said his plan had been received with "great enthusiasm" by the ambassadors he had approached.

'We hope to implement this as quickly as possible, but when you are dealing with governments

this matter is very urgent," he said. Further meetings with the ambassadors had been arranged

The question of whether retraining would be undertaken in South Africa or abroad would be on the agenda, because teacher organisations favoured programmes that would be conducted

Mandela said he had also approached the ambassadors about making more funds available for voluntary severance packages for teachers.

inside the country.

"Education Minister Dr Sibusiso Bengu told me he asked teachers at a meeting in Port Elizabeth how many would take the voluntary severance package and more than half raised their hands.

"I don't think there will be a problem with rationalisation,"

agreement in the education labour relations council, where teachers agreed to a "move or lose" package, would remain unchanged.

This means teachers will still be offered the opportunity to transfer to a more needy school elsewhere or take a "voluntary severance package"

Teachers who remained in the profession would be given an above average increase, and those who opted for retrenchment would forfeit the chance of being re-employed in public schools.

At last night's meeting Mandela revealed his plan to the teachers for the first time.

The head of Sadtu, Mr Duncan Hindle, welcomed the announcement, saying the President had encouraged an approach of reconciliation among teacher organisa-

The president of Naptosa, Mr Leepile Taunyane, said he was especially pleased with the President's assurances that no teacher would land up "jobless and on the

New group out to disrupt education, teacher claims

TEACHERS who threatened to halt classes in the Western Cape if plans to axe jobs were not dropped were playing into the hands of a "political group" that wanted to destabilise the community, Mr Archie Vergotine, head of the Cape Teachers' Professional Association,

Teachers say they are so "disillusioned" with the handling of the retrenchment programme that they will stop giving classes until the government "sorts itself out".

Vergotine spoke of his fears about the new "political movement" just hours before he and other teacher representatives met President Nelson Mandela to attempt to find a way to keep redundant teachers employed.

He said little was known about the group, other than that it operated in the southern suburbs and Mitchells Plain and "capitalised on teacher uncertainty"

The new Western Cape Parent Teacher Student Forum, which organised the first of a series of community protests outside Parliament last week, was not part of any political organisation, its chairman, Mr Des Barthus, said.

"We are concerned about the quality of education in all our schools regardless of whether they are old Model C schools, in the townships or on the Cape Flats,"

The forum was thinking of applying for a court interdict to halt the rationalisation in the Western Cape on the grounds that it was "undemocratic". It was also planning to march to Parliament on May 23.

Mr Mike Reeler, spokesman for the South African Teachers' Association, said that even if the retrenchment plan was stopped, some schools in the province would still lose posts to other, more needy schools.

"The politicians have made a big mistake by using education to get votes because it has backfired.

"Good teachers, who would never have considered leaving the profession before, are getting out just to escape the uncertainty and

The voluntary severance package was to be offered only at the education department's discretion and this had upset teachers more,



Last of prison staff prepare for Robben Island exodus

ROBBEN ISLAND, for decades a centre of incarceration, a place of employment for warders and home to their families, is experiencing a historic changing of the

All inhabitants, including prisoners, are being systematically transferred elsewhere as the Department of Correctional Services relinquishes its 30-year tenure on what is now a national

Of the almost 780 prisoners and 232 staff and their families, only 139 prisoners and 140 staff

These are the people who see to the day-to-day maintenance of the

The rest of the prisoners and prison staff have already been moved to other prisons in the outside Porterville, Allandale at Paarl and Brandvlei at Worcester.

The evacuation was prompted by the decision on December 21 last year to declare the island a national monument.

Mrs Elsa Jones, area manager of the island, said everyone would be off the island by the end of the year, in time for it to be handed over to a department that still has to be designated.

In the meantime, those still on the island attend to the upkeep of essential services such as the ferry, the desalination operation and the power station.

The prisoners are also used to pick up litter on the shoreline. Although it was a penal colony, very little crime was committed on

The 574-hectare island on occasion also served as a leper and 'lunatic" colony, but gained

For many Robben Islanders, some of whom have spent a lifetime on the island and whose children were born on it, leaving is a

traumatic experience. Mr Barry Kruger, chairman of the prison's parole board, has been on the island since December 8, 1981. He and his wife Retha and 11-year-old son Etienne are one of

Kruger, who turns 37 today said: "Robben Island means a lot to me. I have spent one third of my life here and have become attached to the place."

He said his wife had very strong feelings about leaving the island and told him that when it was time to leave she wanted to "leave at night so she can't see the island getting smaller and smaller".

Mr Tokkie Dempers, the former head of supporting services on the island spent six years there. He and his wife Soretta and their three children are now stationed at Allandale Prison near Paarl.

He said his family missed the close bonding and spontaneity of the small community

He was the first officer to leave the island in January. "It was very traumatic, and even now I still feel like an islander. I guess we will always be islanders. You don't forget Robben Island easily," he said.

Man 'talked of killing wife, son'

A WORCESTER man who shot dead his wife and stepson had often told his cousin that he would shoot them when they had made him angry, the Cape Supreme Court heard

Mr Siebert Neethling, 53, has pleaded guilty to murdering his wife, Mrs Marenda Neethling, 44, and his stepson, Wikus, 24, at their home on April 8 last year.

In his plea explanation, he said his wife had often belittled him and sided with her two sons in arguments over their behaviour. On the night he shot her, she had told him she was having an affair. A cousin of Neethling, Mr Andreas van Wyk, told the

court he was staying at Neethling's house on the night of the murder. He was awakened by what he thought were 'crackers" and a few minutes later Mr Neethling ran into his room, saying: "Come and look — I have shot them."

Neethling had often told him he wished to kill his wife and her teenage sons as he became exceptionally angry when they argued or acted against his wishes.

A neighbour of Neethling, Mr Petrus van Rensburg, said that after the shootings, Neethling ran into his house, said he had shot "die donders vrek" and asked for telephone numbers for the police and a dominee.

Clinical psychologist Mr Abraham Nel said Neethling's father had been strict and dominant. Neethling had tried to emulate his example and regarded relatively minor challenges to his authority as personal affronts.

On the night of the murders, his wife's telling him to "be quiet" and admitting she was having an affair had led him to snap, impairing his judgment.

For them the Saturday soccer match and its convivial aftermath is not only the highlight of their week, but their defence against their miserable home life.

Then tall, handsome Jimmy (who looks a lot like Neil McCarthy) meets pretty, sassy Irish lass Annie (Emily Lloyd) at work, falls in love and through her uncle Ken Jackson (Peter Postlethwaite), who is a coach, suddenly finds his dreams of making it into first league soccer are within his grasp. But he first has to learn a few painful essons about self-discipline and responsibility, not only in relation to soccer but to life in general, before it all comes

Director Maria Giese has taken particular care to create the authentic working-class atmosphere of Sheffield and to assemble a cast of believable actors for the various British types that people When Saturday Comes. Not only the 'good" characters like Jimmy and his courageous and encouraging younger brother, but Jimmy's boss, who turns from a colleague to a bully with promotion, and Jimmy's father Joe, a sour and bitter man who blew his chances of soccer success through booze and the horses.

The movie's end might be too "feel good" to be true, out the thorny path that Jimmy takes to get there is all too believable. Specially if you understand how difficult it is to break out of the working-class lot, whether it is in Sheffield

Two lots of brass lift the rafters

SOLID BRASS AND THE WALLACE COLLECTION.

Concert presented by the British Council; conducted by Allan Stephenson. St George's Cathedral.

NO LESS than the playing field, the concert hall is a place where local talent, stimulated by foreign participation, offers above-average entertainment to the spectator, whether in competition or collabora-

In this case, the performance of the CTSO's brass ensemble was enhanced by that of the visiting English brass quintet under John Wallace's capable direction, and the stately setting of St George's Cathedral (not the most likely venue for a concert of secular brass music) added a dash of piquancy to the event.

Billed as "Brass music for all", the pieces chosen ranged from baroque to jazz, although there was a marked preference



for works from the classical repertoire: a sensible compromise which ensured variety while giving a certain coherence to the recital.

Allan Stephenson not only conducted; he also provided the score for the finale, Suite for Double Brass Quintet — an irrepressibly jolly composition which had the players at their most expansive. By the time they came to the encore, The Mexican Hat Dance, they were positively anarchic.

In more sober vein were the baroque works, executed with subtlety and deliberation, while a predictable but welcome inclusion was the rousing Earl of Oxford's

For jazz enthusiasts there was Stardust, featuring an eloquent horn solo, as well as a sassy version of Three Brass Cats, by turns sleek, winsome and swaggering. This was music for all in more senses than one, since proceeds from the concert went to Genesis, a project for training young disadvantaged

Satisfying stuff on all counts.

Natal. He has made several commercial recordings for the SABC, and is leader of the Schwietering Quartet.

Walton's Viola Concerto was given its first performance at one of Sir Henry Wood's Promenade Concerts in 1929, with Walton on the podium and Paul Hindemith as soloist. It is considered to be Walton's finest work.



When South bids 1NT, North may feel a strong urge to use the Stayman Convention to look for a 4-4 fit in hearts.

North yielded to the urge and responded two clubs. South bid two spades, showing his major, and North bid 3NT. Since a spade opening lead had become unattractive, West tried the ten of diamonds. South had two spade tricks, three hearts, two clubs and a diamond, but couldn't get a ninth trick.

DISTRIBUTION

At the second table, North avoided Stayman because he had balanced distribution and ample high-card strength; he raised straight to 3NT, and West naturally led a spade. South won with dummy's nine and took three spades and nine tricks in all.
