PROPOSALS OF TRANSKEI TABLED AT THE MEETING OF TASK GROUP 3 (PROCESS) HELD ON 1991-12-17 AT 9:00.

### 1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 The working group has already identified five working groups.

# 2. COMPOSITION AND ASSIGNMENT FOR WORKING GROUPS

### 2.1 COMPOSITION:

Each working group shall be composed of one delegate plus one back-up from each of the CODESA delegations.

### 2.2 ASSIGNMENT

Each working group shall be given wide powers to research, co-opt experts and consult with a view to producing a document to be presented to CODESA.

#### GROUP 1

# A CREATION OF A CLIMATE FOR FREE POLITICAL PARTICIPATION

- The identification of obstacles to free political participation eg the question of political prisoners; violence; and the continued government by the present regime.
- A look at the ways and means of removing/overcoming such obstacles.
- To consider what would be an ideal climate for such free political participation bearing in mind the effects of the National Peace Accord.
- 4. Role of International Community

- 4.1 To specify the areas of participation if any eg observer, monitor, peace keeping, mediation and arbitration.
- 4.2 To identify which groups should play a role.
- 4.3 To consider at what stage should they participate.
- 4.4 To compare the S A situation with the Namibian one and any other example which comes to mind.

### GROUP 2

## a. GENERAL CONSTITUTION PRINCIPLES

This group must be empowered to search and to look at the broad constitutional principles. Such principles should also include the concept of a Bill of Rights and all that it entails.

# b. CONSTITUTION MAKING BODY/PROCESS

This group shall also identify the Constitution Making Body ie whether it will be a body elected to make the constitution or whether the constitution will be a product of negotiations followed by the elections.

### GROUP 3

### TRANSITION

- Identify a structure which will bring about maximum credibility to all peoples of S A.
  - A structure that will contribute to the creation of a climate conducive to free political participation.
- To consider the question of sovereignty of such a structure.
- 3. The duration of service of such an interim structure.

- 4. The relation of such a structure to CODESA.
- 5. To whom should such a structure be accountable.

### GROUP 4

### TBVC STATES

- i Consider the desirability or otherwise of re-incorporation of such states.
- ii Consider the ideal time for re-incorporation if any.
- iii Consider what should be done with the debts.
- iv Consider the question of transitional arrangements in those states which want to be re-incorporated.
- v Consider what should be done with the infrastructure and other assets.
- vi Consider the fate of the civil service.
- vii Advise on bilateral talks between S A and the states to iron out certain matters.
- viii The exact form of government there.

### GROUP 5

### A. TIME FRAMES

Both the negotiations through CODESA and transitional arrangements/process would be given specific time frames within which to operate.

# B. IMPLEMENTATION OF CODESA DECISION

- Consider ways and means of making the decisions binding to all participants.
- Parliamentary legislation to be made, if any.
