They asked me about Pogo and I told them that I knew nothing about that. They asked me if I was subscribed some money to be a Pogo member. I told them that I didn't know anything about that. I told them that I knew only funeral collections at some times when there is death due to our native customs. I was never beaten up.

Two days after, ~~my~~ I appeared before the Magistrate in Bellwell Court and <sup>I was</sup> remanded. A week after, they questioned me about  $\frac{2}{3}$  of which I gave to Pogo man as a member. I told them that I never connected myself with any congress. I told them that I only knew about funeral moneys which we always give to anyone who calls a round for some collection.

Funeral of a bantú man who was killed by a car in Sea Point. I borrowed 30 c. from my brother Jackson Zumbula at the Hotel. I gave 29½ c. to this man. I wrote my name on his list. He also waited for other boys at my work to collect from them.

About a week later I heard from another boy that the same man and another is outside they wanted to see the boys.

About one week after this I heard from my brother Jackson <sup>who</sup> came & told me that there are boys outside who is speaking to the boys at the Hotel about Pogo.

I told him that he must not put his name down or give money if they speak about Pogo because they will make trouble for us. He told me that they are collecting money for Pogo.

Jackson told me that it is the same man who collected money from me at the first time. I did not go and listen to them.

If the Pogo men had my name on their list as a member I am sure this man took the money that I paid for the funeral as Pogo fees.

I did not attend meetings.

I have no weapons.

I ~~did~~ <sup>do</sup> not know what Hubert says.
