- B. CONFERENCE STEERING COMMITTEE:

- 1. Steering Committee shall direct all the work of Conference and ensure the smooth running of conference as a whole;
- 2. The Steering Committee shall monitor the work of the sessions as tabulated in the Programme and decide where neccessary on procedures to expedite and facilitate deliberations of conference;
- 3. The Steering Committee shall seek to resolve issues that Conference fails to resolve and end deadlocks;
- 4. The Steering Committee shall meet prior to the commencement of Conference and thereafter as and when neccessary;
- 5. The Steering Committee shall approve the distribution of all conference documents;
- 6. The Steering Committee shall be responsible for scrutinising and approving the credentials of all participants;
- 7. The Steering Committee shall have the right to appoint other Committees of Conference and delegate its responsibilities as it shall deem neccessary;
- C. RESOLUTIONS AND DRAFTING COMMITTEE:

- 1. The Resolutions Committee shall report to the Steering Committee;
- 2. The Resolutions Committee shall be responsible for the drafting of the resolutions for Conference, the presentation thereof to Plenary and finalisation thereof;
- 3. The Resolutions and Drafting Committee shall be reponsible for the drafting of Conference Press Statement.

D. RULES OF PROCEDURES:

- 1. Speakers will only be recognised if they follow the appropriate procedure;
- 2. Motions or observations related to the rules of procedure take precedence over other requests to speak;
- 3. On a point of order being raised, discussion should be suspended to allow an intervention of not more than one minute;
- 4. A point of information may be allowed at the discretion of the speaker who must then be allowed to respond;
- 5. All resolutions and motions must be proposed and seconded before they are opened for discussion;
- 6. Draft Resolutions and proposed amendments should be discussed in the order in which they are raised;
- 7. When voting on a document to which there have been amendments, the amendments should first be put to a vote and finally the document with accepted amendments should be put to the vote;
- 8. Questions in dispute not provided for in the present rules of procedures shall be settled by Conference upon proposal by the Steering Committee.

E. SPEAKERS RIGHTS AND PROCEDURES:

- 1. All delegates to conference shall have the right to speak in the plenary sessions and in Commissions;
- 2. Delegates wishing to speak in plenary should indicate such intention by forwarding the appropriate speakers' request note to the Platform;
- Conference Chairperson shall decide upon order of speakers on receipt of such request notes, ensuring a spread of speakers from the various delegations;
- 4. Delegates will be allowed to speak for a maximum of two minutes in Plenary Session unless otherwise indicated;

- 5. Delegates will be allowed to speak only once during the plenary session on each topic;
- 6. Points of order and points of information should be indicated by raising of hands;
- 7. Participants may express themselves in the language of their choice.
