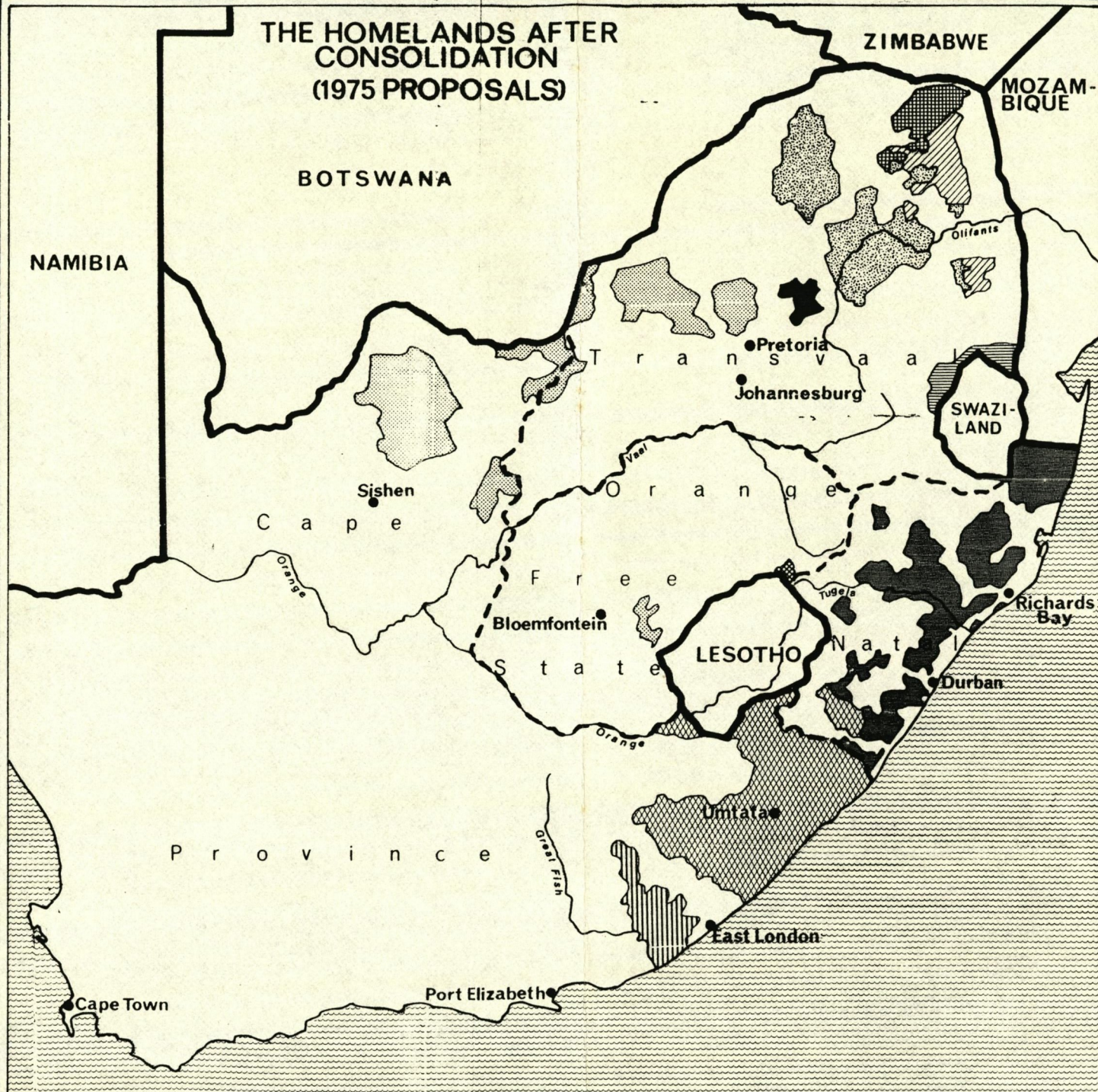

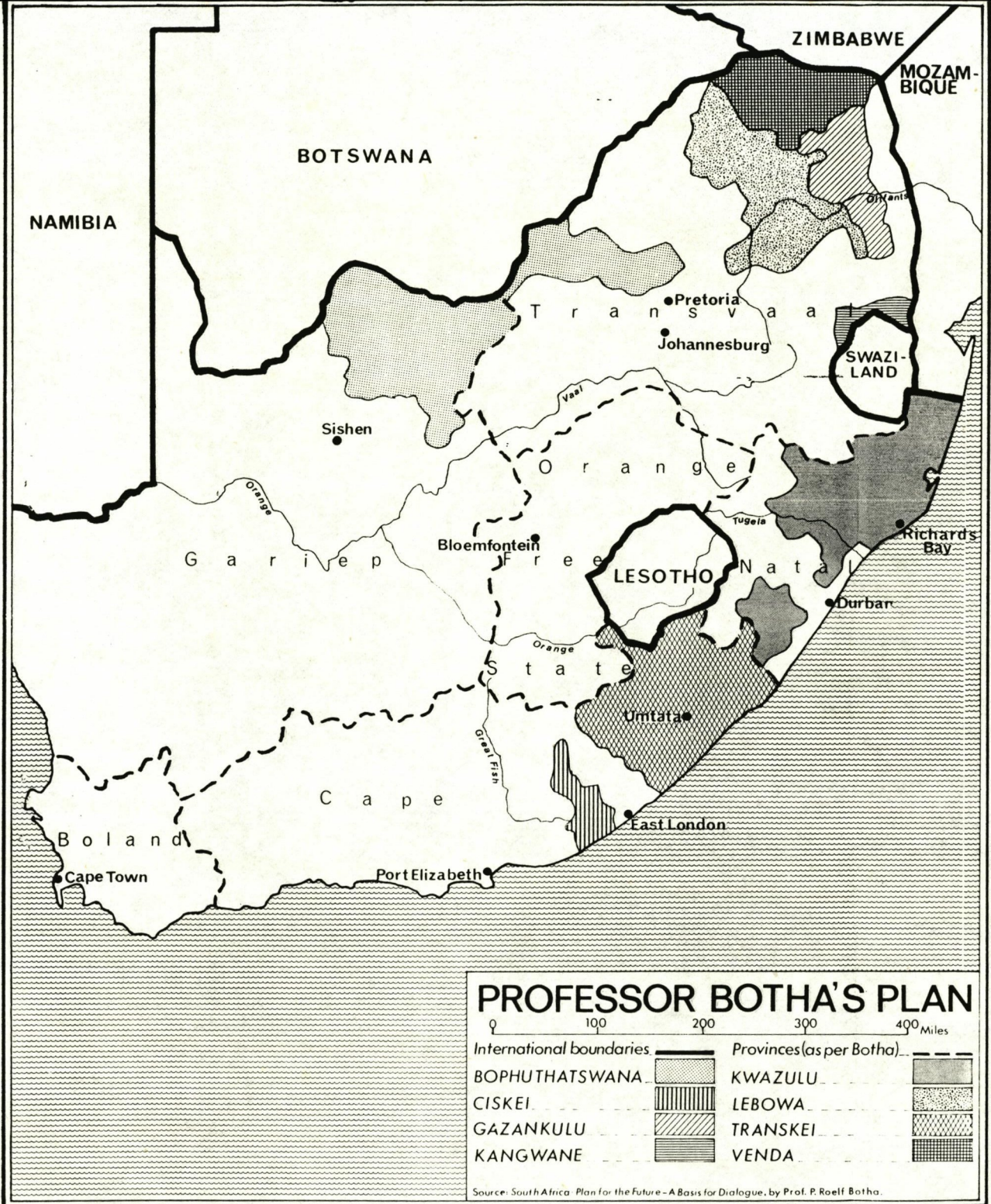

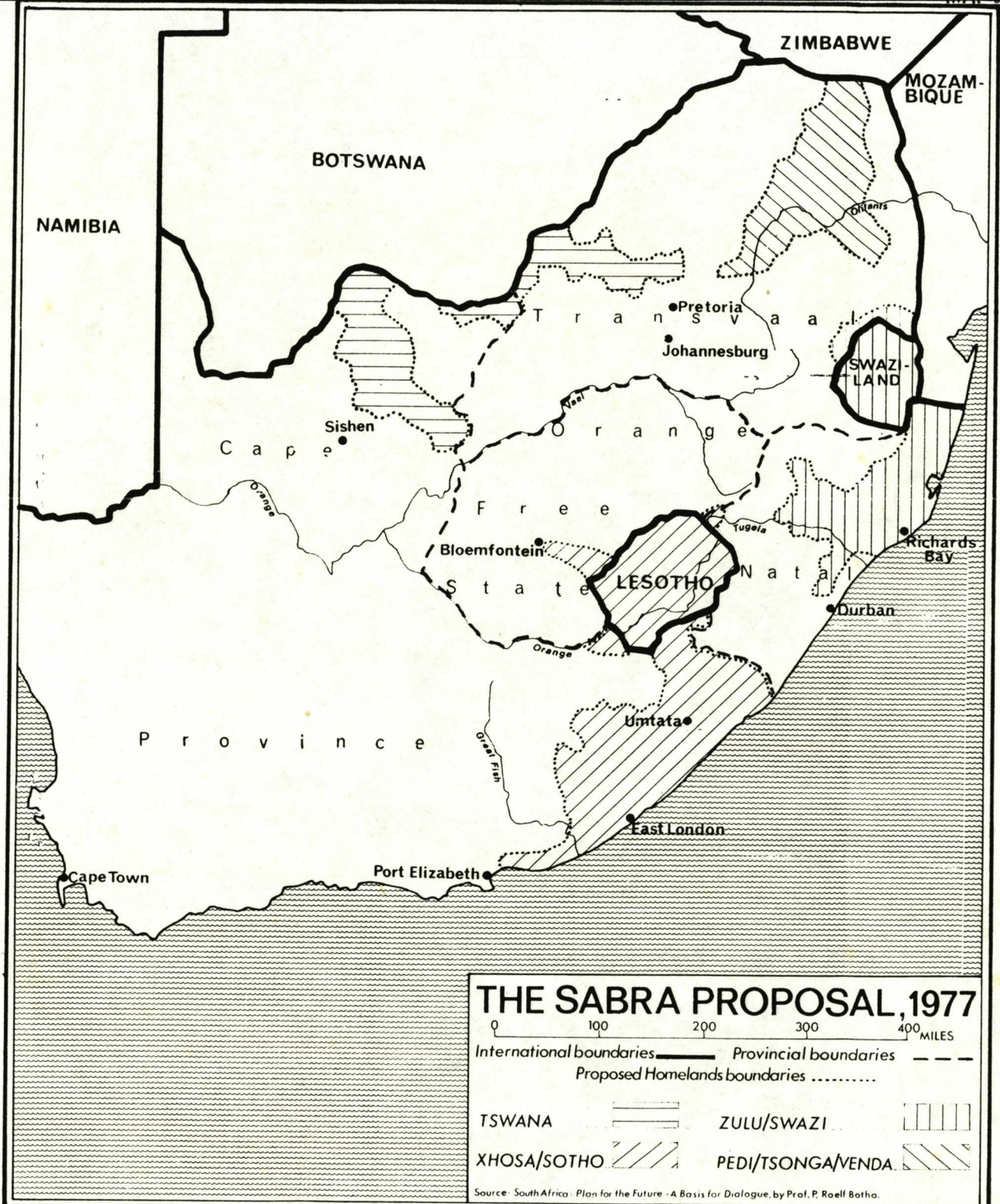

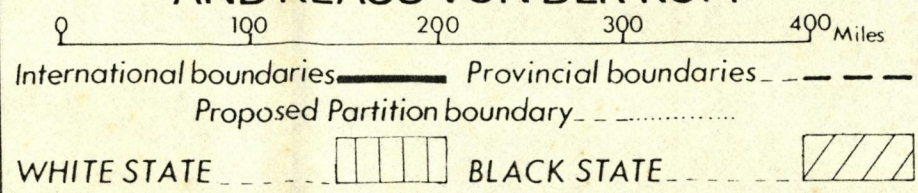








**PARTITION BOUNDARY

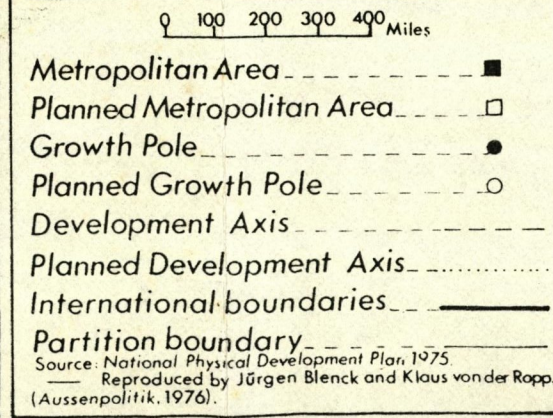
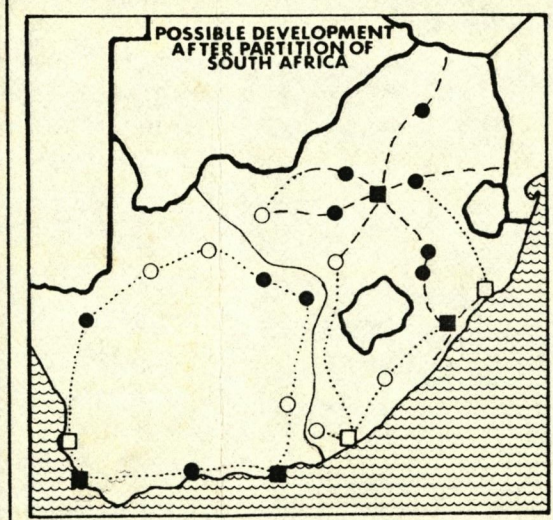
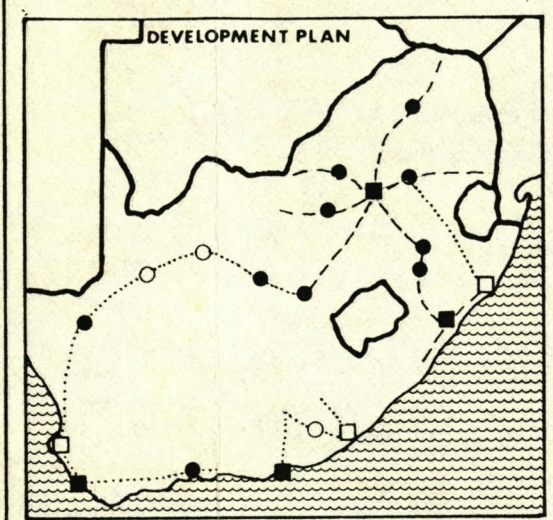
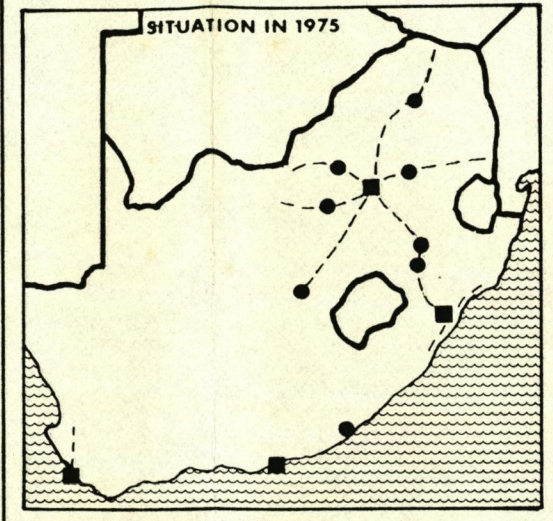
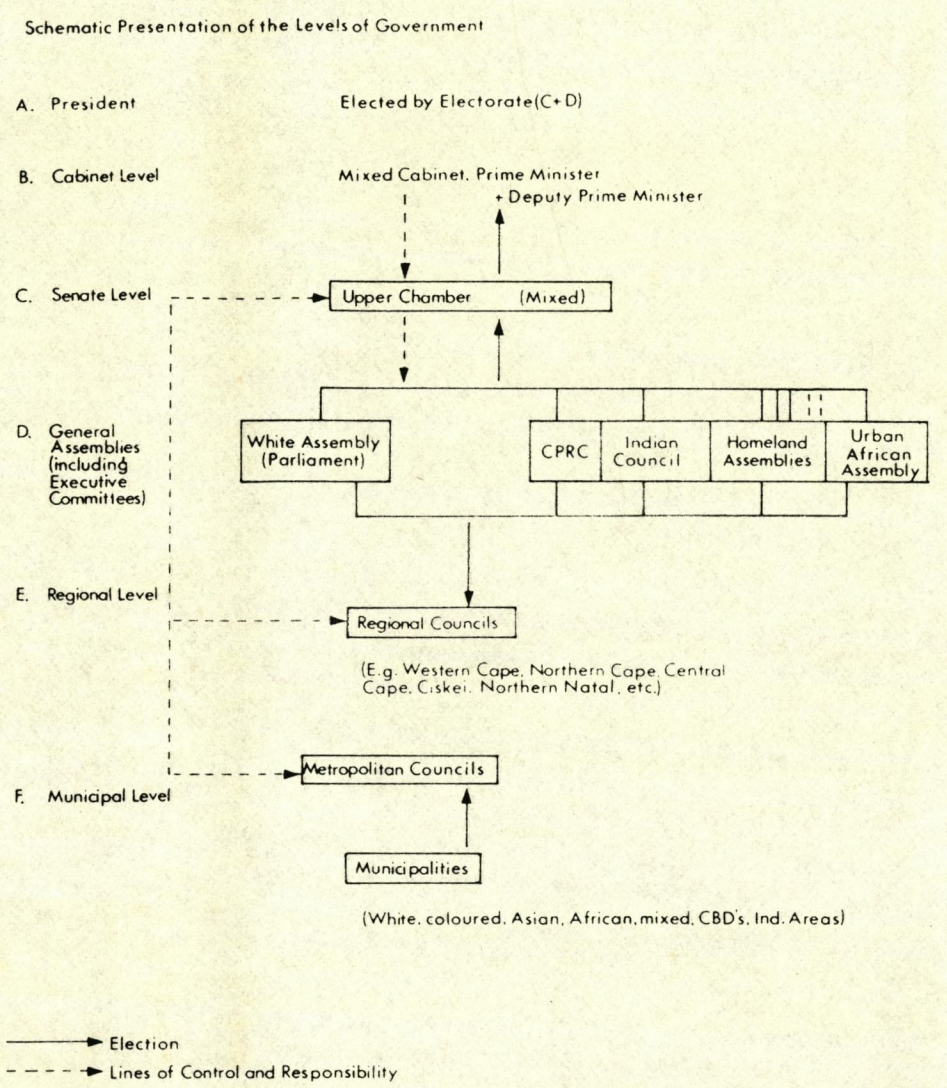
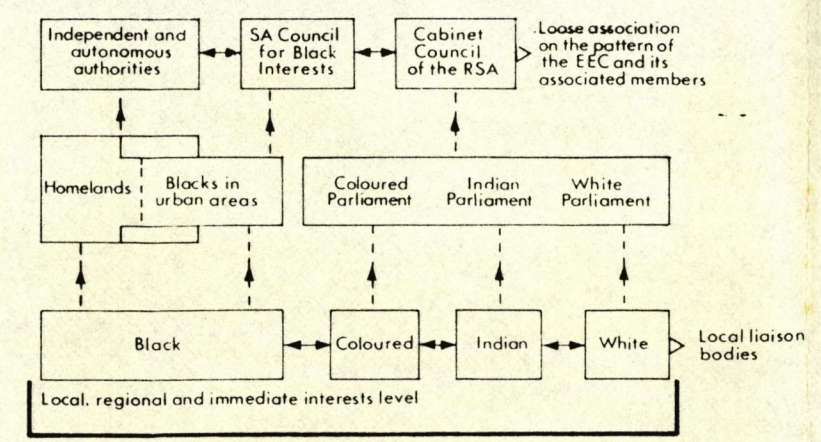


DIAGRAM A: W. THOMAS



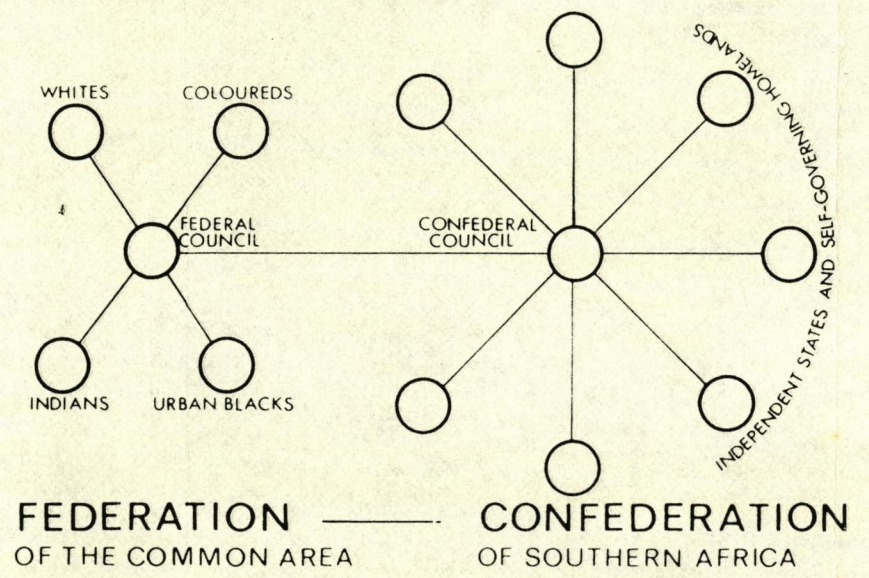

DIAGRAM B: W. J. DE KLERK



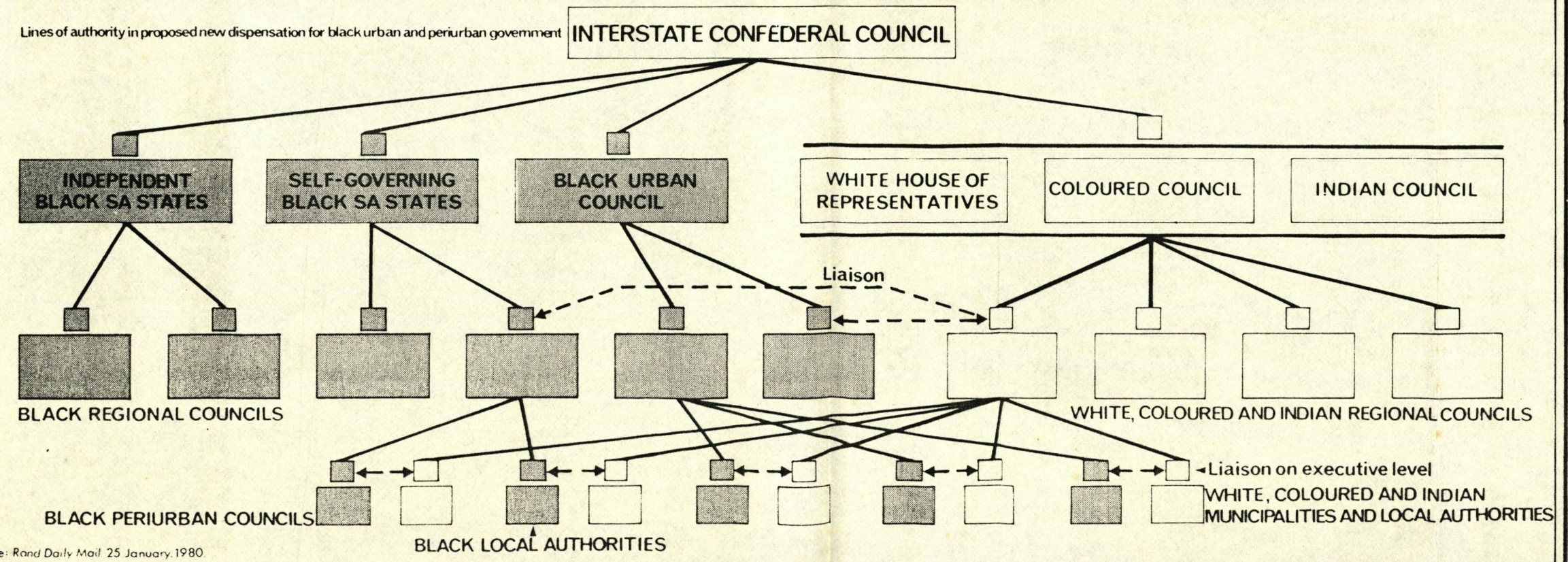
