- (5) Paragraph A.2 of the further particulars dated 19th October, 1964 supplied at the request of accused Nos. 4 and 5.


(b) By the insertion of the words "or coerce as aforesaid" after the word "overthrow" in line 6 on page 2 of the further particulars dated
