SECTORS

- Work to find out more information about organisations seen during the Sector Public Hearing Process will be integrated into a broader community Liaison effort around the Database.
- MPD has paid the R10 000 owing to the Constitutional Assembly and they have also furnished outstanding invoices amounting to R7 748,10. These invoices have been handed to the Finance Department for action.

CPM's

INTERNAL INVESTIGATION

It appears from reports received that -

- SACS (Durban Office) did not confirm the busses prior to Saturday 26 August 1995 (The date of the Empangeni CPM). This led directly to the CA being incapable of securing all the busses it required. On top of this, six pick-up points were not covered.
- The bus company does not address the issue of intimidation which seem to suggest possible collusion in aborting the CPM.
- The SACS (Durban Office) confirmed that they had taken up the irregularities and dereliction of duties re: their staff members performance and have given an undertaking that repetition will be avoided.

CEP

- Memo regarding the current status of the process has been sent to the Co-ordinators, giving details of Working Draft and time frames.
- An order form has been received from Olive re: the HAP booklet. We are still waiting for authorization to order this for each Province.
- Workshops and briefing meetings are progressing well in the Provinces except in the North West where Bouy Gaorekwe was and still is on leave.

- Gert attended training in Cape Town and Joe (Northern Cape) was on compassionate leave.
- **In Gauteng** - The Co-ordinators have requested use of students as actors in role-play. This will have financial implications for the CA re: transport and lunch.
- **KwaZulu Natal** - Radio interview arranged with Louisa re: workshops held in Paulpietersburg was successful.
- Andile Matshela received statement or petition from 'Walk to Talk' group in East London on Saturday 23 September. Maphelo was on hand to assist Andile.
- Nkuli (Eastern Cape) and Sam (North West) have resigned and have already left the CA. We are trying to find replacement for them preferably secondments to fill their positions.
- Bouy has taken another leave (just a week from a leave). He would need to see specialists (Urologist) in Johannesburg.
