WORK GROUP TWO : FIRST ASSIGNMENT

PARA 1.1.3 - AREAS OF COMMONALITY AND ASPECTS WHERE AGREEMENT ALREADY EXISTS BETWEEN THE PARTICIPATING DELEGATIONS

- A. Specific Constitutional Concepts contained in the Declaration of Intent
- 1. Whatever the form of the constitution that will apply within its borders South Africa will be a single (unfragmented/undivided, united) sovereign state.
- The character of the state will be democratic, non-racial and non-sexist.
- 3. The diversity of languages, cultures and religions will be acknowleged.
- 4. All shall enjoy universally accepted human rights, freedoms and civil liberties, including freedom of religion speech and assembly.
- 5. The Constitution will be the supreme law.
- 6. There shall be separation of powers between the legislature, executive and judiciary with appropriate checks and balances (unspecified).
- 7. The Legislature will embrace the following -
 - 7.1 multi-party democracy
 - 7.2 regular elections
 - 7.3 universal adult suffrage
 - 7.4 common voters roll
 - 7.5 in general proportional representation
- 8. The Judiciary
 - 8.1 The Judiciary will be independent, non-racial, impartial
 - 8.2 There will be an entrenched and justiciable Bill of Rights
 - 8.3 There will be a legal system that guarantees equality of all before the law.
- 9. The Executive (no specific comment).

- B. Commitments contained in the Declaration of Intent which may/may not have a bearing on Constitutional Issues
- 1. An undivided South Africa (See also A1)
- 2. A common South African citizenship.
- 3. One nation sharing a common patriotism and loyalty.
- 4. Freedom, equality and security for all.
- 5. Freedom from -
 - 1) apartheid
 - 2) any other form of discrimination
 - 3) domination
- 6. Heal divisions of past.
- 7. Secure advancement of all.
- 8. Establish a free and open society.
- 9. Improve the quality of life of our people through -
 - 1) economic growth
 - 2) human development
 - 3) equal opportunities for all
 - 4) social justice for all.
- 10. Create a climate conducive to peaceful constitutional change by -
 - 1) eliminating violence, intimidation and destabilisation
 - 2) promoting free political participation, discussion and debate. (See First Assignment - Working Group 1)

- C. Matters relevant to the Constitution, not referred to in the Declaration of Intent on which these may/may not already be agreement
- 1. A bi-cameral central legislature.
- 2. Strong central, regional and local governments.
- 3. A constitutional court.
