Only with the transition to democracy


will South Africans be able to improve the quality of life and provide real economic and social solutions to the terrible deprivation experienced by so many millions of our people.

The high price of free elections





However, the cost of fighting these elections on a fair and equal basis is far from free and could well exceed R130 million (approximately \$43 million).

The task is immense.

The ANC will need to establish a working electoral infrastructure throughout the country. It will also have to carry out a programme of voter education for all South Africans, the majority of whom are rural and largely illiterate.

Much of this burden will fall solely on the ANC, since the government does not have the credibility to do it, nor is it in its interest.

Considerable resources will be needed to counter the propaganda efforts of the government which currently controls the national electronic media and which has free and unlimited access to public and state facilities.

We cannot over-stress the need to level

### the playing field.

Unless the ANC acquires the resources necessary to fund an election campaign of this


magnitude, it will not be able to compete on an equal basis.

More importantly, unless the people themselves feel they have actively, knowingly and meaningfully participated, the elections will not be seen to have been fair and free. Consequently the transition to democracy will lack legitimacy and popular support.

# from ANTI-APARTHEID to PRO-DEMOCRACY

### MATERIAL RESOURCES FOR THE ELECTION CAMPAIGN

The ANC will require more than R130 million (\$43 million) to run the campaign. It will also need practical help, which can be made in the form of direct material contributions:

- 108 IBM-compatible 386SE desk-top computers are needed for use in regional (14) and voter education offices (94).
- 94 fax machines with built in telephone answering mechanism for each voter education office.
- 52 motor vehicles 3 per regional office (14 regional offices) and 10 for head office.
- 86 light-weight pick-up trucks plus 4 four-wheel drive vehicles, the latter to be used in remote areas.
- 14 mobile audio-visual vehicles.
- 25 000 C30 audio-cassettes.
- 25 000 C60 audio-cassettes.
- 3000 30 minute video cassettes.
- 800 rolls of 80gsm white bond paper, 980mm wide x 6000m.
- 6 x 400 000 A2 full-colour posters.
- 700 000 T-shirts (plain or printed).
- Ready prepared ANC buttons.
- 14 button-making machines plus raw materials.
- 7000 printed banners, being 5 per branch. (Sizes: 1.5 x 3m or 2 x 6m).
- 70 Public Address Systems.
- 70 TV's (5 per region).
- 70 Video Machines (VCR)3.
