The Apartheid state, notorious for its blatant violation of all forms of human rights, has also been insensitive to other life forms. Animal Welfare work has been left entirely to numerous, often competing, private associations. The National Party Government has consistently refused to provide the appropriate legislation and necessary material resources.

The abdication by the Government of their responsibility in this context, has created a situation where the vast majority of South Africans have no access whatsoever to veterinary services. Once again, those who have been dispossessed have also been denied another basic social service. The Government has shown no interest in assisting animal organisations and these organisations are looking to the ANC-led Alliance to take the initiative.

Consequently, the responsibility of providing the aforementioned services will inevitably fall on an ANC- led Government. It is entirely consistent with the core values of our Alliance that in creating a just humane, dignified, kinder and gentler society, we do not forget any other life forms. Furthermore, at this stage when we are in the process of creating a programme to address the needs of all our people, we should not omit the provision of any essential community service. The issue is a developmental one and should form part of our overall programme.

In this regard the Animal Working Group of the ANC has began a process of consultation with the numerous relevant animal organisations. Although this process is in it's infancy, we have already identified a number of important areas for consideration.
