

We were delighted to read your letter in the Star requesting interested parties to submit recommendations to CODESA for the various working groups.

The Baha'i Community of South Africa is very confident that through consultation and negotiations a firm foundation for a just society will be laid down for this country and we are eager to help in any way possible.

The enclosed document, "Some Thoughts for the Drafting of a Constitution for South Africa" was issued in January 1991 as a response to requests for recommendations about the Constitution. It was originally presented to Justice Olivier of the South African Law Commission and then to members in all the political parties involved in putting together the Constitution.
