Dear Dr.G. Viljoen,

This letter is being written to you on behalf of the PAC of South Africa which is to be distinguished from the PAC of Azania.

PAC of South Africa was established in 1959 by the late Robert M. Sobukwe with the prime aim of negotiating with the South African-Government for a new dispensation for all South Africans.

On the 18th September, 1990 Mr A.B. Ngcobo (the National Treasurer of the PAC of South Africa) and a founder member of the PAC and I interviewed you and discussed our intention to commit ourselves to the policy of negotiation.

On the 24th and 25th May 1991 our organisation participated in the Peace Conference convened by Mr.F.W.de Klerk, the State President.

Because we were late in registering our delegates for the National Peace Accord on the 14th September, 1991 held at the Carlton - Hotel, Johannesburg we were allowed observer status and there I addressed the Peace Conference on behalf of our organisation and I stated categorically that we were prepared to negotiate with the State for a peaceful settlement in South Africa.

We now apply to be represented at the CODESA talks on the 20th & 21st December, 1991 and in all the subsequent discussions, talks and negotiations.

Due to circumstances beyond our control we are making this application at this late stage. For your information we are faxing herewith the mandate from Messrs A.B.Ngcobo and Nana Mahomo members of the National Executive Committee (NEC) of the PAC of South Africa. The full list of our delegation are the following which will include me; Mr.Cecil Zimele Gumede, Mr A.D.Siphika, Mr M.B.Mkhize, Mr V.Nkumane, Mr S.Gumede, and Mr S.Zungu and others.

Can you kindly fax us your reply to our application as soon as it is convenient.
