- All staff that will be assisting will be briefed at 10h00 am on 28 July 1995.
- Research has been conducted around the issue of the government garage cars, we met Mr Freitag the Director of Government Garage in the Eastern Cape.
- We also had launched our investigation around this issue with Mrs Venitia Mostert of parliament and as well as Mrs Eakland - head of Government Garage in Cape Town (Head Office of the GG).
- Today (27 July) we are holding a joint Community Liaison / Media Department workshop to work out a joint programme for the Second Phase of the Public Participation Programme.
