
Sir,

I enclose herewith Departure Permit No. P 03120 issued to you in terms of section 5(6) of the Departure from the Union Regulation Act, No. 34 of 1955, to enable you to leave the Republic permanently and have to invite your attention to the provisions of section 6 of the abovequoted Act, which reads as follows:-

- "6 Any person to whom a permit endorsed as provided in sub-section (6) of section 5 has been issued and who has left the Union for the purpose of proceeding to a place outside the Union shall-
- (a) if he thereafter returns to the Union be deemed for the purpose of section 2 to have left the Union without a valid passport or permit;
 - (b) for all purposes become a prohibited person within the meaning of the Admission of Persons to the Union Regulation Act, 1913 (Act No. 22 of 1913) in the Union with effect from the time he so left the Union."

In terms of section 15(1)(c) of the South African Citizenship Act, No. 44 of 1949, as amended, a South African citizen ceases to be a South African citizen should he for purposes of admission to the Republic of South Africa become a prohibited person.
