REPORT OF THE SUB-COMMITTEE ON THE PARTICIPATION OF THE ZULU KING AND TRADITIONAL LEADERS IN CODESA

- 1. The Sub-committee met on Wednesday, 5 February at the World Trade Centre. The following persons were present :
 - T J Mohapi (Convenor) F T Mdlalose N J Mahlangu N M Malekane (for M J Mahlangu)

2. Procedure

The sub-committee discussed the principle of participation by political parties/organisations/ administrations, and also discussed the different applications by the Zulu King and traditional leaders (see Addendum A). Certain submissions were also taken note of.

3. Recommendations

- 3.1 Recognising that participation in Codesa is primarily the prerogative of political parties, organisations and administrations, but in view of the important role played by hereditary leaders in the country's history and in the present day, it is recommended to the Management Committee that in addition to political parties/organisations/administrations, hereditary leaders be allowed to participate fully in Codesa.
- 3.2 This applies to the following :
 - 3.2.1 The Zulu King should be allowed full participation in Codesa through his own delegation.
 - 3.2.2 With regard to other senior hereditary leaders, it is recommended that one delegation per region, headed by one senior hereditary leader in a specific region (i.e. the self governing territories and TBVC states), should be allowed full participation in Codesa. The composition of these delegations should be determined and submitted by the authorities in the regions.
- 3.3 It is recommended that the Management Committee requests the present administrations in these regions to make all efforts to be even handed in the composition of each delegation, for it to be as broad as possible.
- 3.4 It is recommended that the above delegations should be invited to join the Management Committee and the Working Groups immediately with full participation of delegates and advisers. This also applies with regard to participation in Codesa 2.
- 3.5 With regard to the application of Contralesa and other formations of chiefs/magoshi/amakhosi it is recommended that in the light of the above decision, these leaders could be included in the delegation of hereditary leaders in each region.

4. Conclusion

It is hoped that through this report the sub-committee has fulfilled its task. Any new applications could be processed along these principles.





REQUEST FOR THE VENDA NATIONAL PARTY AT CODESA FORUM AS INDEPENDENT

- Venda National Party is greatly encouraged by the progress achieved so far in the establishment of Codesa where a new South Africa which is non racial, democratic and just will be shaped.
- 2. Venda National Party is the only legitimate democratic elected Party which represent the aspiration of the majority of the citizens of Venda and the winner of not only the three consecutive general elections held during the period 1973 - 1988, but also organisers of Venda Independence in 1979, the position of which will in all probability require the attention of CODESA. On that note, Venda National Party express its willingness and support for the reincorporation of Venda into South Africa.
- 3. Venda National Party admit, there were mistakes made in the past by the previous Venda National Party Leadership in the Government which resulted in the handling over of the Government to soldiers. But Venda National Party as a Party during or after the coup never disband, it remain active and alive up to date, equally determend to join other political new South Africa.

4. THEREFORE :

4.1 Venda National Party wish to express to CODESA Management Committee Chairperson its willingness to attend and participate in the CODESA deliberations. In the foregoing, Venda National Party wish to express its absolute support of THE DECLARATION OF INTENT already tables and signed at CODESA by other participants.

4.2 The first and second invitations to Venda were both specifically directed to the Government and none was specifically directed to the Government and none was specifically directed to the Government and none was specifically directed to the Government and Parties in Venda. Venda National Party wish to submit to CODESA to consider peaceful and democratic means for the replacement of military Governments in the TBVC by democratic interim Governments.
