Statement made by Foreign Minister Michio Watanabe on the Referendum on reform in the Republic of South Africa

- The Government of Japan welcomes the fact that, in the referendum held on 17 March 1992 in the Republic of South Africa, the continuation of President F W de Klerk's reform process was reaffirmed by an overwhelming majority.
- 2. The result of the referendum clearly indicates that the negotiation process between the parties concerned, started by the "Convention for a Democratic South Africa (CODESA)", has gained wide-ranging support, thereby making the reform aimed at the enactment of a new constitution more solid than before.
- 3. The Government of Japan hopes that all the parties concerned in South Africa will accept the result of the referendum and seriously participate in the negotiations for the establishment of a democratic and free system without racial discrimination, so that the reforms in South Africa will make steady progress.
