Unit Submission On :-STRUCTURES AND PRINCIPLES OF A CONSTITUTION FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOUTH AFRICA.

- On the spenfer questions set and by Code Skineging, the following views are put forward -
 - (a) The President should be an Executive President, conswerable to Darlament.
 - (b) Consistent with the above, the President Should be elected by Porhament.
 - (c) It is considered that the Mahanal Assembly should be the sovereign body of the state. Re Prisident is the premost executive office. Conswerable to Parliament.
 - (d) We accept the documents proposal for two Houses of Parliament, the functions set out for each. and the proposed method of election. [but see (h) below].
 - To avoid over centralisarian of government, we suggest to provisions in the Constitution that:

- (i) executive functions be delegated to the lowest competent tier of government.
- (ii) that the documents shogestion that frontions be delegated to regional and local government does not go for enough to meet (i) above; rather, we would wish to see local and regional government having fower to decide an effective means of achieving national aims.
- (iii) that the constitution should include prevision for local and regional government to vaise revenues autonomously of central government, and howe total control over the use to which that vevenue is put (subject of course to the Constitution).
- (10) attematively to (ii) above, local of
 regional government should be afforded
 complete autonomy over the
 chopson of a set percentage of
 its revenues.
- (V) It is air view that there will be need for a local gaverment act 4 a regional government act, and that the Constitution should not constrain the development of these Acts.

- (f) accountability of officials may be strengthened by Eusising that the Girl service commission is Empasered to review appointments of all officials advising on policy famulation at 5 yearly intervals.
- (9) Both officials and organs of government will be more accountable if there is a regiments for reports / accounts to be passed both "up" for approval and "days" for comment. If electors were able to append comments on these reports before they were possed "up" for decision, the process of accountability would be geneinely clemo aratic.
- (h) To genienely and dreathy provide egnal opportunities for woman, it is considered that all seats in the National Assembly and the Sancte Shall be paired, and the electoral process praide for the electoral process praide for the electoral of one man and one women to each 'seat'.
