

STANDARDS FOR GRADING AND GRANTING CREDIT

GRADING SYSTEM 1

Courses are graded one of three ways:

Grades used to calculate grade average are given numerically:

85-100	A
78-84	B
70-77	C
62-69	D
50-61	F

Letter grades are given in some elective non-examination courses: A, B, C, D, F.

Some elective non-examination courses are graded PASS/FAIL.

ADDITIONAL GRADING SYMBOLS

- # Grade removed from grade average calculation.
- @ Repeated course; average of the two grades received in the course is used in calculating grade average
- I Grade of incomplete assigned
- NR Grade not yet recorded
- W Withdrew
- WF Withdrew failing

GRADING SYSTEM 2

In May 1982, the grading system was changed from a numerical to a letter system, starting with the class of 1985. Courses are graded one of two ways:

Letter grades used to calculate grade average:

A	4.0
A-	3.7
B+	3.3
B	3.0
B-	2.7
C+	2.3
C	2.0
C-	1.7
D	1.3
F	0.0

Letter grades (above) are given in some elective non-examination courses but are not used in calculating grade average.

Some elective non-examination courses are graded PASS/FAIL.

CREDIT TYPE

- I INSTITUTIONAL
Credit and honor points calculated into grade point average
- T TRANSFER
Credit transferred from another institution.
Credit NOT calculated into grade point average.
- N NON-GPA
Credit and honor points NOT calculated into grade point average.
- R REQUIRED FIRST YEAR
Courses required of all first-year students. Credit and honor points calculated into grade point average.
