The ANC, COSATU and the SACP in the Western Cape have dedicated May Day to our fallen heroes Oliver Tambo and Chris Hani. The central regional May Day rally will be held at Athlone Stadium on Saturday 1 May. Rallies will also be held in Oudtshoorn, Atlantis, Namaqualand and Worcester.

The initial program of mass action for the region will be presented to the people at the rally at Athlone Stadium. The rallies will also focus on the demands of the three organisations for:

- a date for democratic elections for a constituent assembly to be set by the end of May 1993.
- 2. joint control of the SADF and SAP
- 3. a reconstruction pact to outline the economic policies of a democratic government which will meet the needs of the poor and oppressed.

The rally at Athlone Stadium will be preceded by marches and motorcades from various areas to the venue.

The tripartite alliance in the Western Cape calls on all workers and democrats to participate in the May Day program. Let us mourn our fallen heroes, let us build worker power!
