RE: TSOTETSI RECOMMENDATION TO CODESA: MONARCHIES

In response to your advisory communication to the people of His Majesty Monarch Mokgalo Tumisi Tsotetsi dated 24 April 1992, I am, however, convinced that steps such as those you have taken to bring into our attention the names of people who have already submitted written notes to the sub-committee of CODESA, will bring about the opportunity to me to make an independent decision on further persuasions to have some personal contact with the Chief Executive Councillor Dr T.K. Mopedi for top-level discussions of other people whose names cannot be recognised and accepted by Tsotetsi Royal Management Committee unless the question of the Molois is cleared by all those people whose names have been forwarded to me with regard to the administration of South Africa or Pretoria (PHUTHALADITSHABA) QOQUA.

In all matters pertaining to the Witwatersrand area the names of the Molois (Bokgolokwe people) must be included. I have already indicated in your reply to Tsotetsi how those people's names should have been submitted to CODESA so as to enable its sub-committee to reach the true state of this country's kingdoms. So the question of Molois has always been left out by leaders of that homeland and to my awareness the traditional leaders are also excluding the Molois chiefs.

TSOTETSI'S NEGOTIATIONS

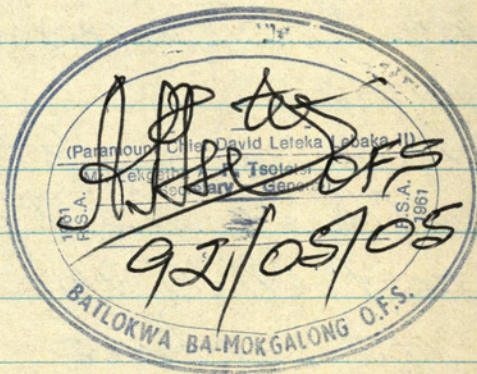
Dear Sirs & Madams

RE: CODESA'S RECOGNITION OF SOUTH AFRICAN ROYALTIES' PARTICIPATION RECOMMENDED-TSOTETSI.

Tsotetsi Royal Management Committee have pleasure in declaring its recommendation as follows:-

- (a) The position of CODESA so far is clear to the people of His Royal Highness and are pleased with the way CODESA is running its affairs and are hopeful of an achievement of an everlasting majoritarian constitution by CODESA in which SA Kingdoms will be legally and constitutionally entrenched;
- (b) Matters of the Monarchy of Zululand be referred to the people and leaders responsible at Ondini;
- (c) The question of traditional leaders has not yet been recognised by all

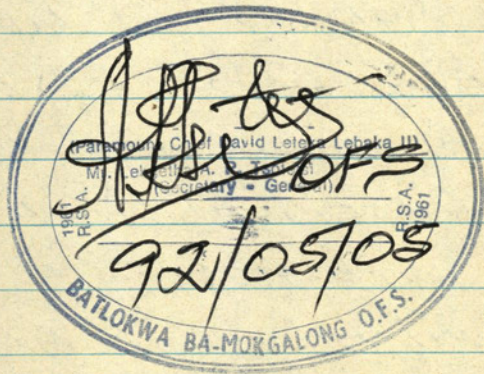
matters of our negotiations with Pretoria, Mafikeng, Ullundi, Umtata, Vrede and Bloemfontein and therefore irrelevant and unacceptable;

(d) Matters of QkwaQkwa people who had already presented an oral submission be referred to the Chief Executive Councillor Mr Tee Kay Mofedi and be not reflected in our representations to CODESA because we are not homeland people, but a nation of His Majesty The King;

(e) The word or name "WITZIESHOEK" does not apply to any of the people whose correspondence boxes or box numbers have been given to us and as a result CODESA can be viewed as an instrument used to despoil the people of Morena T. Moloi of their own ancestral areas;

(f) Contact with any Kguakgwa people or leaders has always not been possible with delegation of Monarch Tsotetsi through correct channels and contact with them will really serve a very little or no purpose at all because they have disabled the incorporation of the homeland into His Royal Highness' Motgalong and, they are still ^{being} administered by the homeland Chief Councillor Dr T.K. Mofedi;

(g) Only the late Mr Monrafela Hamilton

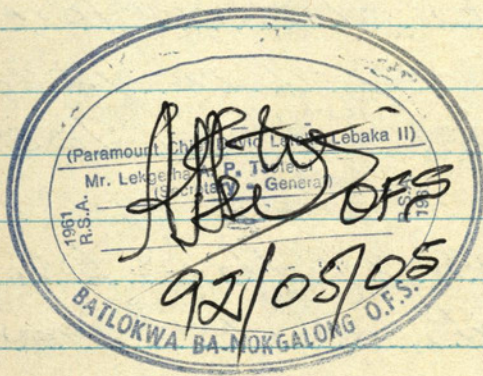


Molefe made himself available and he had contact with royal Tsotetsi's in Mafutswe-Wits region;

(h) lastly, our national matters/negotiations still continuing with Pretoria, are not to be influenced or dictated by any of the national states or any of the homeland traditional leaders as we also maintain a policy of non-interference in matters affecting people in the homeland of Quakwa.

As you are aware, much has always depended on the performance of the descendant royal houses of His Royal Highness King Tumis' Tsotetsi and on majority of issues we have already agreed upon with Springs, Vrede, Bloemfontein and Pretoria outside the administration of this homeland.

Tsotetsi Royal Management would like to thank all parties/participants of CODESA Management Committee for their commitment to the peoples of this country, for their hard work during the consideration of our written representations to it, and for the significant contribution in return to our Royal Management Committee by CODESA dated 24 April 1992 and which have been made by you all to try to bring the peoples of Makgalong and Mokotleng into a better position

not only of CODESA but of His Majesty King David Mokgalo Tsotetsi to face the challenges of the future of South Africa.

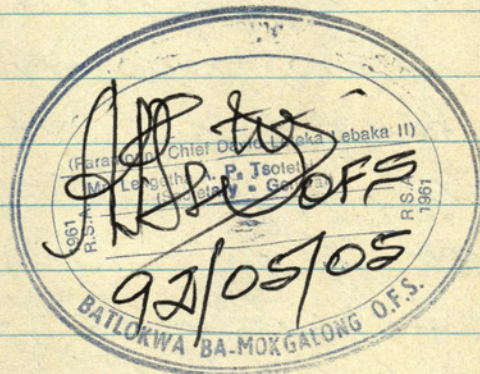
There are still hard times ahead, and today's negotiations through CODESA for a non-racial constitution are but one of the problems we all face, however the people of Monarch D. L. Tumisi Tsotetsi are positive that if we work and participate together faithfully through CODESA we will see out this difficult time in our transitional negotiations.

In conclusion, the matter contained in the contents of your reply dated 24 April 1992 will be brought to the attention of The Honourable The Commissioner-General, His Excellency The Honourable The International Leader Dr M.G. Buthelezi and the Orange Free State Administrator Mr L.J. Botha for their persuasion to the homeland Chief Executive Councillor Mr T.K. Mofedi to have personal contact with me for top-level discussions in Treda or Pretoria, possibly the King will be included.

In the light of the delay by Dr T.K. Mofedi the question of his traditional leaders is still premature.

Your letter dated 27 February 1992 refers.

As you are aware the sub-committee on participation of the Zulu King and other Traditional Leaders in Codesa is still continuing with its work. It has heard a number of oral submissions and considered a number of written submissions, of which yours is one.

To date no recommendation from the sub-committee has been forwarded to the Codesa Management Committee for consideration with regard to the possible participation of the Zulu King and other Traditional Leaders in Codesa. At the same time, the sub-committee would like to request that, in anticipation of any decision by the Management Committee, you take up contact, at your earliest convenience, with the Traditional Leaders from the Qwa Qwa area.

It is the view of the sub-committee that the sooner such contact is established, the easier it will be for your views to be reflected together with the views of Traditional Leaders coming from Qwa Qwa.

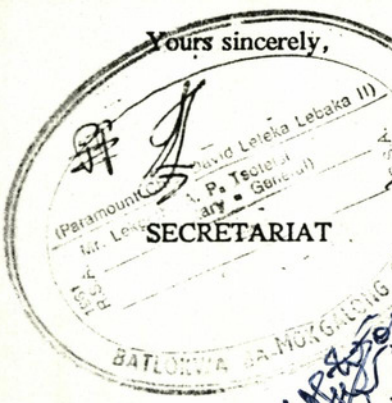

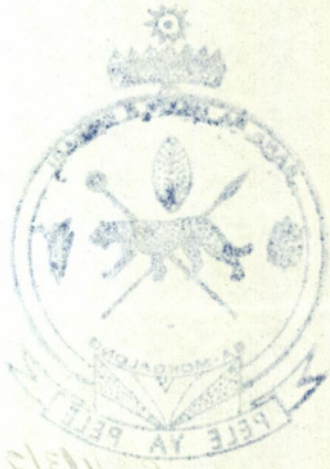
