THE annual "carrot dangling" contant among Indian political parties to lure members of other parties on to their side appears to have swung into action again with this year's "carrot" being a place at the Convention for a Democratic South Africa II (Codesa II) in March.

One of the first to accept the Codeas carrot was Chatsworth politician Mr Ramcharitar Pauday, who after 11 turbulent years has demped Mr Amichand Rajbens's National Peoples Party (NPP) to join Mr Yellan Chineamy's Reform Party after indications that he was to be dropped from the NPP's delegation to Codess II although he had been a delegate of the party to Codess I in December.

Mr Panday also claimed that former NPP member Mr Ashwin Mehaniall, now ministerial representative of the ruling party fieldarity in the HoD, was ready to rejois the NPP.


