ADDRESS BY THE LEADER OF THE UNITED PEOPLE'S FRONT MR. M.N. RAMODIKE DURING A SESSION OF CODESA II 15 MAY 1992

THE CHAIRPERSON OF THIS CONVENTION. L'EADERS AND DEL'EGATES FROM VARIOUS POL'ITICAL' PARTIES AND ORGANI—ZATIONS, OUR SPECIAL' GUESTS FROM BOTH THE ORGANIZATION OF AFRICAN UNITY, AND THE UNITED NATIONS, AS WEL'L' AS THE SECRETARY GENERAL' OF THE BRITISH COMMONWEAL'TH OF NATIONS, DIGNITARIES PRESENT HERE, MY COUNTRYMEN IT IS INDEED A PL'EASURE FOR ME TO COMMENT ON CERTAIN ASPECTS OF THE REPORT AS GIVEN.

Mr. CHAIRPERSON WHEN WE FIRST MET HERE IN DECEMBER L'AST YEAR WE SAID WE WERE MAKING HISTORY.

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TODAY WE HAVE RECONVENED TO REVIEW THE PROGRESS MADE. INDEED WE HAVE RECONVENED TO PROVE TO THE COUNTRY THAT THE FORUM WE HAVE CREATED HAS THE WORL'D THE CAPACITY TO TAKE US SOMEWHERE. WITH THE RESOURCES AT OUR DISPOSAL'. COUPL'ED WITH OUR RESOL'VE AND DETERMINA-TION TO PUT AN END TO THE PREVAIL'ING POL'ITICAL' INJUSTICE, INSTABIL'ITY, UNCERTAINTY AND THE **GENERAL'** TORTURE OF OUR PEOPL'E'S INTEGRITY THROUGH VIOLENCE, WE HAVE NO REASON TO FEAR THE FUTURE.

I WISH TO TAKE THIS OPPORTUNITY TO THANK THE MEN AND WOMEN ENGAGED IN THE VARIOUS WORKING GROUPS ESTABL'I-SHED BY THIS CONVENTION DURING ITS FIRST SESSION FOR THE TIREL'ESS EFFORTS THEY HAVE MADE TO ARRIVE

AT THE CONCLUSION THAT CAUSED US TO GATHER ONCE AGAIN AND ENDORSE THE PROGRESS MADE. THIS PROVES ABOVE EVERYTHING ELISE THAT GENUINE NEGOTIATIONS CAN DELIVER A SETTLEMENT CAPABLE OF ACCOMMODATING THE INTERESTS OF ALL OUR PEOPLE.

I BEL'IEVE THAT WE HAVE SUCCEEDED SO FAR IN THIS REGARD. MR CHAIRPERSON, WHILE THE UPF IS FULLLY APPRECIATIVE OF THE PROGRESS MADE BY THE SOUTH AFRICAN GOVERNMENT AND THE ANC ON THE RELEASE OF POL'ITICAL' PRISONERS AND THE RETURN OF EXIL'ES, WE WISH, HOWEVER TO SAY THAT THIS MATTER NEEDS TO BE EXPEDITIOUSLY HANDL'ED AND DISPOSED OF IN ORDER TO COMPLETE THE PROCESS OF RECONCIL'IATION.

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FURTHERMORE, THE UPF BELIEVES THAT FOR US TO L'EVEL' THE PLAYING FIELD, COGNIZANCE SHOUL'D BE TAKEN OF THE FACT THAT THIS PROCESS CANNOT BE FULLLY COMPLETED IF L'AWS THAT MILLITATE AGAINST FREE POL'ITICAL' ACTIVITY CANNOT BE REPEAL'ED AND REPL'ACED BY L'AWS THAT WILL' BE IN THE INTEREST OF THE COUNTRY AS A WHOLE. LAWS SUCH AS THE INTERNAL' SECURITY ACT AND THE PUBL'IC SAFETY ACT MUST BE REPEAL'ED OR AMENDED AS SOON AS POSSIBL'E TO ACCOMMODATE THE NEW ERA THAT WE ARE TRYING TO SHAPE.

I AM PARTICUL'ARL'Y PL'EASED TO REAL'IZE THAT SUFFICIENT CONSENSUS WAS REACHED AS FAR AS THE DECL'ARATION OF A STATE OF EMERGENCY IS CONCERNED. ON OUR PART, WE ARE SUPPORTIVE OF THE AGREEMENT REACHED THAT

A STATE OF EMERGENCY SHOULD ONLY BE DECL'ARED ON THE ADVICE OF A MUL'TIPARTY INTERIM EXECUTIVE, AND THAT SUCH A STATE OF EMERGENCY SHOULD BE OBJECTIVELY JUSTICIABLE IN A COURT OF L'AW.

MY ORGANIZATION DOES NOT, HOWEVER, SUPPORT THE VIEW HEL'D BY OTHERS THAT SUCH A DECL'ARATION OF THE STATE OF EMERGENCY SHOUL'D BE RETROSPECTIVE AS IS THE CASE NOW. ON THE ISSUE OF REFUGEES AND OTHER DISPL'ACED PERSONS, THE POSITION OF THE UPF IS VERY CL'EAR AND THAT IS:WHILE WE APPRECIATE THE CIRCUMSTANCES UNDER WHICH THE REFUGEES FROM MOZAMBIQUE FL'ED THEIR COUNTRY, WE ARE AL'SO MINDFUL' OF THE FACT THAT THE CIVIL' COMMOTION IN THAT COUNTRY HAS NOW SO SUBSIDED THAT THESE REFUGEES

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SHOUL'D BE REPATRIATED TO THEIR HOMEL'AND. OUR COUNTRY,

SOUTH AFRICA IS CAUGHT UP IN A SPIRALL'ING WAVE OF

VIOL'ENCE AND UNEMPL'OYMENT WHICH ARE ATTRIBUTABL'E INTER

AL'IA, TO THE WORSENING SOCIO-ECONOMIC CONDITIONS.

THE INFL'UX OF THOUSANDS AND THOUSANDS OF THE REFUGEES

INTO OUR AREA WHICH IS ITSEL'F RAVAGED BY VIOL'ENCE,

HUNGER AND STARVATION TENDS TO WORSEN AND NOT IMPROVE

OUR OWN CONDITION. THE EASY SUPPLY OF AK 47 RIFL'ES

IN THE NORTHERN AND EASTERN PARTS OF OUR COUNTRY

AND THE MANY MURDERS AND RAPES THAT HAVE NOW BECOME

A FEATURE OF OUR EXISTENCE CALL'S FOR A SERIOUS REVIEW

OF THE POSITION OF THE REFUGEES WHO ARE THEMSEL'YES

EXPLOITED TO FULL ADVANTAGE BY THE WHITE FARMERS IN THAT REGION. WE CANNOT ALLOW THIS SITUATION TO CONTINUE. I HOPE AND TRUST THAT THE TASK FORCE THAT HAS BEEN APPOINTED TO L'OOK INTO THIS MATTER WILL COMPLETE ITS ASSIGNMENT IN DUE COURSE.

MR. CHAIRPERSON, AS VIOL'ENCE ESCAL'ATES IN OUR COUNTRY DAY BY DAY, I WISH TO STATE THAT AS SIGNATORIES TO THE NATIONAL' PEACE ACCORD, THE UPF IS FULLLY SUPPORTIVE OF THE MEASURES AGREED TO IN WORKING GROUP I TO STRENGTHEN THE NATIONAL' PEACE ACCORD NOT ONLY BY GIVING

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IT L'EGAL' ENFORCEABIL'ITY BUT BY PROVIDING THE NECESSARY INFRASTRUCTURE TO MAKE IT EFFECTIVE. WE CANNOT HAVE FREE AND FAIR EL'ECTIONS IF VIOL'ENCE IS AL'L'OWED TO DOMINATE OUR SOCIETY. THAT IS WHY I PARTICUL'ARL'Y APPL'AUD THE PRESENCE OF THE DEL'EGATION SENT BY THE OAU TO MONITOR VIOL'ENCE IN OUR COUNTRY.

ON THE QUESTION OF THE STATE-CONTROLL'ED MEDIA SUCH AS THE SABC RADIO AND TV. OUR POSITION IN THE UPF IS THAT CONTROL' OF SUCH BODIES MUST BE IN THE HANDS

OF AN INDEPENDENT, NEUTRAL' BODY. THE UPF IS IN FULL' AGREEMENT WITH THE CONDITIONS AS SET OUT IN THE REPORT OF WORKING GROUP I VIS-A-VIS THIS SUBJECT.

IT IS OUR VIEW IN THE UNITED PEOPLE'S FRONT THAT

AN ELECTED CONSTITUENT ASSEMBLY BE ENTRUSTED WITH

THE TASK OF DRAWING UP THE CONSTITUTION OF THIS COUNTRY.

WE SAY SO ON THE BASIS OF OUR BELIEF THAT AN IMPORTANT
DOCUMENT SUCH AS THE CONSTITUTION REQUIRES A PROPERLY
MANDATED BODY TO DRAFT AND FURTHER TO REMOVE ANY

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QUESTION ON THE AUTHENTICITY OF MEMBERS PARTICIPATING IN THAT EXERCISE. WE ARE GL'AD THAT MUCH PROGRESS HAS NOW BEEN MADE TOWARDS THIS END WHICH WILL AL'SO SERVE AS AN IMPORTANT STEP IN WIDENING DEMOCRACY IN THIS COUNTRY.

FURTHERMORE, REGARDING THE PRINCIPLES ON WHICH THE CONSTITUTION SHOULD BE BASED THE UNITED PEOPLE'S FRONT DEEMS IT IMPORTANT TO PROTECT CITIZENS' RIGHTS BY WAY OF A BILL OF RIGHTS AND TO ENSURE THE SEPARATION

THAT NEW REGIONAL' BOUNDARIES ARE REQUIRED URGENTLY
FOR PURPOSES OF ARRANGING FOR DEMOCRATIC EL'ECTIONS
AND FURTHER WISH TO EXPRESS THE VIEW THAT SUCH EL'ECTIONS
SHOUL'D ENSURE PROPORTIONAL' REPRESENTATION. WE SUBSCRIBE
TO THE IDEA OF REGIONAL' GOVERNMENTS WHICH SHOUL'D
BE STRONG AND EFFECTIVE ENOUGH TO ADMINISTER MATTERS
OF A REGIONAL' NATURE. SUCH GOVERNMENTS, HOWEVER,
SHOUL'D HAVE L'IMITED POWERS THAT WILL' NOT IMPEDE THE
PROMOTION OF NATIONAL' OBJECTIVES BY THE CENTRAL' GOVERN-

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NOR SHOUL'D SUCH REGIONAL' GOVERNMENTS BE AIMED AT THREATENING THE TERRITORIAL' INTEGRITY OF THE CENTRAL' GOVERNMENT.

WE IN THE UPF BELLIEVE THAT THERE SHOULD BE 70% SUPPORT ACROSS THE BOARD FOR THE ADOPTION OF THE CONSTITUTION, AND 75% FOR THE BILL OF RIGHTS.

ON THE QUESTION OF THE SENATE, OUR VIEW IS THAT THIS BODY IS UNNECESSARY. HOWEVER, IF SUFFICIENT CONSENSUS IS REACHED FOR THE ESTABL'ISHMENT OF THE SENATE WE WISH TO MAKE IT CATEGORICAL'L'Y CL'EAR THAT THE UPF CAN ONL'Y SUPPORT THE CREATION OF THIS BODY ONLY IF

IT IS TO BE DEMOCRATICALLLY ELECTED AND FURTHERMORE,
THAT IT SHOULD NOT HAVE ANY VETO RIGHTS.

MR. CHAIRPERSON, THE L'EVEL'L'ING OF THE POL'ITICAL' FIEL'D REMAINS BASIC TO THE PROCESS OF TRANSFORMATION. THE CREATION OF MUL'TIPARTY SUBCOUNCIL'S WILL' SERVE AS A POINT OF DEPARTURE AND PL'AY A BAL'ANCING ROL'E IN OUR TRANSITION FROM THE OL'D TO THE NEW ORDER.

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THE UNITED PEOPLE'S FRONT ENDORSES THE GENERAL' CONSENSUS REACHED BY ALL DEL'EGATIONS AT CODESA ON THE REINCOR-PORATION OF THE TBVC STATES INTO SOUTH AFRICA, WHICH AGREEMENT IS IN L'INE WITH CODESA DECL'ARATION OF INTENT TO BRING ABOUT A UNITED, DEMOCRATIC, NON-RACIAL' AND NON-SEXIST SOUTH AFRICA.

THIS IS INDEED ONE OF THE MIL'ESTONES ACHIEVED BY

CODESA TO DO AWAY WITH APARTHEID - CREATED STRUCTURES

WHICH CREATED A FAL'SE IMPRESSION THAT PEOPL'E IN THESE

TERRITORIES WERE INDEPENDENT WHEN IN PRACTICE THEY

REMAINED DEPENDENT ON THE REPUBLIC OF SOUTH AFRICA.

TODAY WE ARE PL'EASED THAT CODESA HAS PAVED THE WAY

FOR THE PEOPL'E OF THE TBVC STATES TO REJOIN SOUTH

AFRICA WITHOUT BEING SUBJECTED TO UNNECESSARY ETHNIC

REFERENDA AS THE ONLY MEANS OF TESTING THEIR WILL.

WE DEEPLY APPRECIATE THE VISION DISPLAYED BY THE TRANSKEI, VENDA AND CISKEI GOVERNMENTS AND WISH TO ASSURE THEM THAT WE HAVE AL'WAYS REL'IED ON THEIR WISDOM TO BRING US WHERE WE ARE TODAY. IT IS OUR WELL' CONSIDERED OPINION THAT THE PEOPL'E OF SOUTH AFRICA

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CANNOT JUSTIFIABLY PRONOUNCE APARTHEID DEAD WHILE
WE STILL RETAIN THE HOMELANDS (BOTH INDEPENDENT AND
SELF-GOVERNING) IN THEIR PRESENT FORM AND INDEED
IF WE WERE TO EFFECTIVELY UNDO THE DAMAGE DONE BY
APARTHEID WE WOULD HAVE TO BEGIN WITH THE GEOPOLITICAL
INTEGRATION OF THE COUNTRY. THE VIEW HELD BY THE
UPF IS THAT ANY SO-CALLED INDEPENDENT TERRITORY WHICH
REFUSES REINCORPORATION SHOULD NOT BE ENTITLED TO
ANY OBLIGATORY FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FROM SOUTH AFRICA.
THE AGREEMENT REACHED BY CODESA THAT THE TBVC STATES
WILL FULLY PARTICIPATE IN ALL THE PHASES OF THE PROCESS OF

TRANSITIONAL' ARRANGEMENTS AND CONSTITUTION-MAKING INCL'UDING NON-RACIAL' EL'ECTIONS TO BRING ABOUT A NEW DEMOCRATIC SOUTH AFRICA IS COMMENDABL'E.

THE UPF, HOWEVER, NOTES WITH REGRET THE RESERVATIONS EXPRESSED BY THE BOPHUTHATSWANA L'EADERSHIP WITH REGARD TO REINCORPORATION. OUR CONCERN IN THIS REGARD L'IES IN THE FACT THAT OUR FELLOW COUNTRYMEN IN THAT TERRITORY REMAIN SHUT OFF FROM THE DEVELOPMENTS IN THEIR OWN COUNTRY OF BIRTH AND PREVENTED FROM PARTICIPAING

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IN THE PROCESS UNDER THE CLOAK OF WHAT IS ACTUAL'LY NOMINAL' INDEPENDENCE. NEITHER SOUTH AFRICA NOR THE PEOPL'E OF THAT TERRITORY WILL' FORGET THE MANNER IN WHICH INDEPENDENCE WAS IMPOSED ON THEM AND WE ALL'STILL' RECALL TOO VIVIDLY THE CRUEL AND MOST UNSCRUPUL'OUS PATH TO INDEPENDENCE. IT IS VERY IRONIC MR. CHAIR-PERSON THAT THE HUNDREDS OF THOUSDANDS OF OUR PEOPL'E WHO HAVE BEEN FORCIBLY INCORPORATED INTO THAT TERRITORY AMID PROTESTS, OUTRAGE AND RESISTANCE FROM ALL' QUARTERS, TODAY CAN BE SAID TO BE JEAL'OUS OF THEIR INDEPENDENCE.

SUDDENLY THEY HAVE BECOME PATRIOTS OF A HOMEL'AND.

LET IT BE KNOWN MR. CHAIRPERSON THAT IT SHOUL'D NEVER

BE EXPECTED OF US IN THIS COUNTRY, EVER TO ABANDON

OUR FOLLOWERS AND FELLOW COUNTRYMEN WHO ARE RESIDENT

IN THOSE COUNTRIES ON WHOM INDEPENDENCE WAS IMPOSED.

TO THE L'EADERSHIP IN SUCH TERRITORIES, WHOM WE REGARD

AS BROTHERS, WE HOPE THEY REAL'IZE SOONER THAT THE

PINCERS OF REAL'ITY ARE CL'OSING IN ON THEM. MAY WE

REMIND THEM OF THE WORDS OF CHARL'ES DICKENS WHEN

HE SAID: "DON'T DO TOMORROW WHAT YOU CAN DO TODAY".

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TO FACIL'ITATE THE PROCESS OF REINCORPORATION UPF URGES CODESA TO IMMEDIATELY ESTABL'ISH THE THREE COMMISSIONS AS AGREED UPON TO WORK OUT THE MODAL'ITIES TO ENSURE THE SMOOTH RETURN OF THESE STATES. LET US ALL JOIN HANDS TOGETHER IN A SPIRIT OF RECONCILLIATION AND RENEWAL.
