On Budget Day tomorrow, Cyril Ramaphosa, Chris Hani and Jay Naidoo will demand entry into parliament in order to present the economic demands of the people.

This will be the culmination of the People's Budget rally and march starting on the Parade at 1pm Wednesday 18 March.

The action has been organised by the ANC, COSATU, the SACP and other organisations to draw attention to the illegitimacy of the present racially constituted tricameral parliament and will highlight the continued inequalities in spending on pensions, education and other areas. Despite an appearance of change, the allocation of government funding is still firmly entrenched along racial lines.

We will reiterate our demands for an Interim Government to rule the country during the transition as well as an elected Constituent Assembly to draw up a new constitution. Organisations and unions representing the different sectors have drawn up demands which have been incorporated into a symbolic People's Budget - to be presented to parliament as was the People's Parliament bill.

Speakers on the Parade will include the three Secretaries-General of the ANC, SACP and COSATU as well as Winnie Mandela, John Gomomo, Joe Slovo and Allan Boesak, ANC Regional Chairperson.

The People's Budget Rally will take place the day before the arrival of Dr Nelson Mandela who will be in the Western Cape from the 19th to 23rd March.

**\*\*There will be a press conference in the City Hall after the People's Budget March at 3.30. The national leadership will be available to discuss the march and respond to the referendum result and its implications for Codesa and the way forward.**

### PRESS STATEMENT

re: MR MANDELA'S VISIT TO CAPE TOWN

On Thursday 19 March at 9am, ANC President Mr Nelson Mandela will begin his first full visit to the Western Cape since his release two years ago. During his visit he will brief ANC members and other democratic sectors on progress at Codesa.

The focus of his visit will be a Sharpeville Memorial Rally in Khayelitsha on Saturday afternoon. Before the rally, Mr Mandela will attend a ceremony of remembrance for the two people killed in Langa in 1961, followed by a motorcade through Bonteheuwel, Gugulethu, Nyanga and Khayelitsha.

While in Cape Town, Mr Mandela will meet with a number of important sectors including union, business, religious, sports leaders and diplomats. A highlight of his visit will be a tour of the historic sites in and around the Bokaap area - including the Old Mosque and the Tuang Guru Shrine on Thursday 19th.

On Sunday, Mr Mandela will address a rally in Paarl, an event of some special significance because it was there that Mr Mandela spent the last years of his imprisonment and there too that, had there been sufficient notice, the Release Rally was due to have taken place.

Another long overdue commitment will be Mr Mandela's visit to Saldanha Bay on Friday. A previous visit was cancelled due to his urgent involvement in the release of hunger striking prisoners in May last year.

Mr Mandela's visit is eagerly awaited by ANC members in the Western Cape and a large crowd is expected to await his arrival at the airport on Thursday morning.

\*\*An itinerary of Mr Mandela's programme follows. At this stage there may still be minor changes but a final itinerary will be available from the ANC offices tomorrow afternoon.
