Re: Project Rainbow - Economic and Political Implications

Project Rainbow is a global rehabilitation program. You are no doubt aware of the Hole in the Ozone Layer, The Greenhouse Effect, and Global Desertification. As convenor of Rainbow it is my duty to inform you that I am in possession of extensive scientific data which leads me to the conclusion that these problems are certainly reversible. Further these problems are inextricably linked to many of our environmental, political and economic problems.

Imagine a New South Africa where the average rainfall is 1100 mm per annum! Where hail and frost are a thing of the past! Where subsistence farming is possible everywhere! Where food is in abundance! Where the economy is booming! Where man can live with peace in his heart! Impossible you say! This is the very objective of Rainbow. Gentlemen, I am talking about reality, a reality that can be made to happen. We need only reach out and take it.

In order to implement the scientific principles of Rainbow the cooperation of all men is required. In this country Codessa is such a forum. The matters of which I speak are presently being discussed on the parliamentary level and President De Klerk is already in possession of much vital information in this respect.

This matter is urgent. Many well respected scientists, philosophers and researchers are warning us that our present course is leading to disaster. I thus urge you to consider the implications of this letter most seriously.

This letter serves only as an introduction. The data already collected is so extensive that it is not reasonable to convey in a simple letter. I therefore make my self available to offer a formal presentation at your earliest convenience.
