Dear

In response to your recent enquiry regarding your organisation's involvement in the CODESA process, we advise that full participation is limited to political parties/organisations and administrations from South Africa and its self-governing territories, as well as to representatives of the administrations of the TBVC states (Transkei, Bophuthatswana, Venda and Ciskei).

Five Working Groups have been established as detailed below. With regard to interest groups not qualifying for full participation in CODESA, the CODESA Management Committee decided at its meeting on 10 January that "each Working Group shall determine ways and means by which women's groups and other interest groups which are not participants in CODESA may make submissions to that Working Group on matters relevant to its terms of reference."

The manner in which Working Groups will receive submissions is still under consideration by the Working Groups. In the meantime, in order to facilitate any submissions which you may wish to make, we outline below the tasks assigned to each of the five Working Groups:

- * Working Group 1 Creation of a Climate for Free Political Participation
- * Working Group 2 General Constitutional Principles
- * Working Group 3 Transitional Arrangements / Interim Government/Transitional Authority
- * Working Group 4 Future of the TBVC States
- * Working Group 5 Time Frames and Implementation of CODESA's Decisions

The precise terms of reference of each of the above five Working Groups are available from our offices on request.

We thank you for your interest in the CODESA process and trust that this letter will assist you in determining whether or not your organisation would be interested in making submissions to any particular Working Group.

Dear

Thank you for your recent application for inclusion in the CODESA process. With regard to the issue of the participation of the King of the Zulus and other traditional leaders, the CODESA Management Committee, at its meeting on 10 January 1992, decided as follows:

1. A Sub-committee, consisting of four members, was established with a mandate to investigate and make recommendations to the Management Committee on an appropriate role in the negotiations process for the King of the Zulus and other traditional leaders.
2. For this purpose, scholars and experts should be given the opportunity to present evidence, attention being given to pre-colonial and governmental states as well as to historical, cultural and ethnic considerations and comparable constitutional situations in Africa and elsewhere.
3. The Subcommittee is to report back to the Management Committee in advance of the next plenary meeting of CODESA.
4. All interested parties not represented on this Subcommittee will be welcome to make representations to it.
5. The Subcommittee consists of Mr TJ Mohapi (convenor), Dr F Mdlalose, Mr MJ Mahlangu and Mr NJ Mahlangu.
6. The Subcommittee only having been appointed recently, it has yet to determine the manner in which it receives submissions.

For administrative reasons we advise that, should you wish to make representations to the Subcommittee, your communication to this effect should be forwarded to this office, marked for the attention of the Subcommittee for Traditional Leaders.

Addendum C

MEMO FROM THE SECRETARIAT TO THE DMC CONCERNING CERTAIN ASPECTS
AIMED AT FACILITATING THE FUNCTIONING OF THE WORKING GROUPS.

1. The CODESA administration will provide the necessary administrative backup resources including minute takers for each Working Group as well as sub-groups that a particular working group may decide upon. We would like to suggest certain additions to be made by the DMC to the "guidelines for Chairpersons of Working Groups of CODESA" in order to ensure the smooth functioning of the Working Groups.
2. The ultimate function of the Working Groups is to present CODESA Plenary session with a report of agreements etc. relating to the tasks assigned to a Working Group by CODESA. Such reports may be in the form of interim as well as final reports.
3. Chairpersonship of Working Groups
 - 3.1 Should a single chairperson be appointed by a Working Group the final responsibility to guide the Working Group towards the compilation of reports and to ensure that the reports are presented to a CODESA plenary session would rest with the Chairperson. Even so, given the magnitude of the task, it would be useful to set up a mechanism drawn from the Working Group concerned to assist such a Chairperson.
 - 3.2 If a system of rotating Chairpersons is decided upon by a Working Group the need for a mechanism drawn from the Working Group becomes even more necessary. Such a mechanism would require a clear mandate as to who is/are responsible for guiding the Working Group towards the compilation of reports and the presentation of these reports to a CODESA Plenary.
4. We would like to recommend the DMC consider the above problems in a different and more comprehensive manner which would at the same time ensure a certain degree of uniformity as to the manner in which each of the working groups attend to this problem.
 - 4.1 We suggest that each Working Group appoint a small Management Committee (WGMC), comprising 3-4 persons drawn from within the Working Group.
 - 4.2 The Chairpersons for the Working Groups should be drawn on a rotational basis from the WGMC. If it is felt that this is too narrow a pool from which to draw the rotating Chairpersons then it will be necessary to establish some relationship between the WGMC and a Chairperson who may have chaired a particular session of the Working Group but who is not a member of the WGMC.
 - 4.3 We envisage that each of the Working Groups would require persons who would be involved in a considerable amount of drafting documents/decisions and reports. We suggest that capable people from amongst the advisors and/or delegates of the participants in a Working Group be used for this purpose in the capacity of a rapporteur/s. In this way both competence in drafting as well as the political sensitivities of a Working Group will be better accommodated.
 - 4.4 Such a rapporteur/s would be an additional member/s of the WGMC on an ex

officio basis.

- 4.5 The WGMC should be charged with the task of preparing the agendas for each session of the Working group.
 - 4.6 Should a Working Group establish sub-groups in order to attend to its tasks arising from its terms of reference, the WGMC shall also serve as the mechanism through which the Working Group co-ordinates the work of its sub-groups.
5. Submissions to Working Groups by Women's and other Interests Groups:
- 5.1 Some guidance is required to ensure that the existence of the Working Groups is not prolonged indefinitely and that it is able to meaningfully attend to submissions made to it. We recommend that :
 - 5.1.2 In the first instance Working Groups should receive submissions through the WGMC in the form of written submissions.
 - 5.1.3 Only in certain clearly determined cases should a Working Group entertain, in addition to the above written submissions, oral submissions by a specific interest group. Such a determination could be made by the WGMC, subject to the advice of the Working group.
