## IMPLICATIONS AND ISSUES ARISING FROM THE TERMS OF REFERENCE OF WORKING GROUP 5

By the re-organisation and elimination of overlapping in specific areas of the terms of reference of Working Group 5 it is possible to create a work programme for Working Group 5.

## Regarding Agreements

Working Group 5 should

- (a) Record agreements reached
- (b) Create regular updated comprehensive lists of all decisions, actions and processes involved
- (c) Investigate and report on all proposals (from all WG)
- (d) Identify key issues and problems that need to be addressed in the implementation of agreements
- (e) Identify areas of commonality and where agreement already exists
- (f) Draft the documentation required to give effect to the agreements reached (i.e. legislation/regulation etc)
- (g) Identification of that legislation which needs to be enacted/amended
- (h) Identify the steps which need to be taken by the parties to further the implementation of agreements or decisions reached at Codesa
- (i) Investigate the practical effect of implementation of agreements
- (j) Dissemination of up to date information on progress, to Codesa participants, interested parties, authorities
- (k) Co-ordination of the activities of Codesa and subsidiaries

## Regarding Time Frames/Target Dates

Working Group 5 should

- (a) Investigate the practicability of setting target completion dates for all agreement/activities/ decisions
- (b) Make recommendations regarding appropriate time frames and target completion dates for all processes and assignments undertaken by Codesa and all its Working Groups
- (c) Monitoring of progress in Codesa and adjustment of targets when necessary.

The above synthesis of the terms of reference of Working Group S lead inexorably to the conclusion that there should be two sub-committees of Working Group 5:

- One sub-committee to deal with all agreement, process and implementation matters, and
- One sub-committee to handle all time frame and target date matters.

The Working Group Steering Committees to handle all administrative matters.

These committees could consist of one representative of each delegation, plus one adviser.
