## DIKWANKWETLA PARTY OF SOUTH AFRICA

SUBMISSION TO SUB-GROUP 3 OF WORKING GROUP 4. THE ADMINISTRATIVE, FINANCIAL AND PRACTICAL EFFECTS OF IN-CORPORATION OF TBVC STATES.

- 1. RE-INCORPORATION :
  - TBVC States should be in-corporated constitutionally back to S.A. By this action the territory of S.A. would be re-established as it was in 1961 with the transition of the union to the Republic of S.A. We proposed that the S.African Government should be urged, to facilitated through Parliament, for the process of orderly dissolution of the independence of the TBVC States. Thus a remedial TBVC States in validation and re-incorporation act should be promulgated by which S.A. should, prior to the neew constitutional order for S.A. take over and resume overall authority over the affected territory/
- DISPOSAL/TRANSFERS OF ASSETS:

  The suggestion of Dikwankwetla Party of S.A. is that all stated assets be transferred to S.A. Any person who holds any property or assets in trust for any of the TBVC States such person shall, from the transfer date hold such property or assets on trust for the South African Government.
- 3. OPTIONAL USE OF EXISTING INFRASTRUCTURE:

  After re-incorporation of TBVC States should be entrusted to South African Government as the care taker administration. The Status of the development projects is to be discussed bilaterally, between the South African Government and the affected TBVC State, in order to determine which projects, must continue without interruption which must be reviewed for possible alteration and which may be frozen for future re-consideration.
- 4. <u>DEBTS OF TBVC STATES</u>:
  South African Government must be requested by Codesa to
  address the question of TBVC States debts. A logical solution
  would be to inherit and write off TBVC debts.

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- 5. ADMINISTRATION OF TBYC STATES :
  - The good administration of each TBVC States shall immediately after the re-incorporation and after coming into effect of the TBVC States invalidation and re-incorporation act, invested in the South African Government as the administration.
- During and after re-incorporation, every Civil Servants should be deployed as much as it may be possible in the same capacity, or in a corresponding ofice established by the constitution of South Africa, asif he had been appointed to do so in accordance with the provision of the constitution. Provided that any person who under the existing law would had been required to vacate his oofice at the expiration of any period, should vacate his oofice at the expiration of that period. All relevent pension benefit should be honoured.
