WORKING GROUP V

TIME FRAMES AND IMPLEMENTATION OF CODESA'S AGREEMENTS

STATEMENT FOR SUBMISSION TO A CODESA MEETING ON 6TH FEBRUARY 1992

The terms of reference of Working Group V direct it to monitor progress in other Working Groups, identify problems, identify key issues, identify commonality and aspects where agreement already exists between participating delegations and then to address:

- questions relating to information flow and co-ordination of activities of CODESA and its subsidiary bodies and to investigate setting time-scales for the completion of assignments.
- monitoring progress, adjusting targets, disseminating updating information:

and

- looking at the consequences of work done by the four other Working Groups in terms of legislation or amendments thereto. Considering the legality of the process in relation to time frames to be negotiated "within the context of constitutional continuity", the practical effects and other matters the Working Group may consider relevant to its brief. [And examine and clarify the meaning of these terms of reference.]

These terms of reference can only be prescriptive once Working Groups have commenced their tasks and have produced the problems and the successes which form the subject matter of the concerns of Working Group V.

Working Group V can therefore at this stage of the commencement of the work of other Working Groups only establish liaison between the four other Working Groups and itself. To this end, it is recommended:

1. Working Group V establish liaison links with the other four Working Groups with a view to receiving in-puts from all participant parties to all Working Groups with a view to analysing them and drawing out their implications in terms of the subject matter of its own terms of reference.
2. Provide for the publication of regular reports to all Working Groups on the status and the success with which each Working Group is proceeding.
