5.A Government

RE-INCORPORATION: PROCEDURAL STEPS

- Procedures agreed upon regarding "testing the will of the people" on re-incorporation or otherwise can only be implemented once agreement had been reached by CODESA on either the interim or final constitutional arrangements for South Africa.
- 2. Procedurally speaking, Working Group 2 or 3 will have to consider the findings of Working Group 4 in order for this Working Group to formulate a proposal upon which the will of the people in the TBVC states could be tested.
- 3. Should consent not be reached in Working Group 4 on the proposals of Working Groups 2 or 3 the matters should be referred back to these Working Groups for renegotiation.
- 4. Once consensus has been reached and the proposals of Working Groups 2 or 3 and 4 have been accepted by CODESA, only then can the will of the people of South Africa and TBVC states be tested regarding re-incorporation or otherwise.
- 5. Informing the people of the interim or final constitutional package and the holding of a referendum in the TBVC states to test the will of the people form the next steps.
- 6. The next step is that referendums should be held on request of the respective governments in each of the SATBVC countries. This could be done on the same day or on separate days.
- 7. If the people of any of the TBVC countries indicate that they want to form part of the new South Africa, their government should apply to South Africa for re-incorporation.
