DRAFT MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF SUB-COMMITTEE TWO (CITIZENSHIP), OF WORKING GROUP 4 (THE FUTURE OF THE TBVC STATES) HELD AT THE WORLD TRADE CENTRE ON MONDAY 17 FEBRUARY 1992 AND TUESDAY 18 FEBRUARY 1992

PRESENT: Delegates (See Addendum A)

C Marivate (chair)

1. Chairperson's opening remarks

Delegates were welcomed by the chairperson.

2. Chairperson

The meeting confirmed C. Marivate's appointment as chair subsequent to a resolution of the sub-group's meeting on 17 February 1992.

3. Agenda

The meeting agreed to discuss citizenship (Item 1.4 on the Terms of Reference to sub-committee 2 of WG 4).

4. Citizenship

4.1 It was agreed that the Declaration of Intent be used as guideline for resolving the issue of citizenship in the TBVC states. However, the sub-committee 2, should at all times keep to its specific Terms of Reference, viz "citizenship" in the TBVC states.

4.2 The TBVC states were each given a chance to outline what maintains in their respective territories regarding the question of citizenship.

5. Restoration of citizenship (views of TBVC states)

- 5.1 Transkei and Venda support restoration of South African citizenship en bloc.
- 5.2 Ciskei supports restoration of SA citizenship subject to involving the people of its territory.
- 5.3 Bophuthatswana does not support restoration of South African citizenship en bloc but allows its citizens to renounce their Bophuthatswana citizenship if they so wish.
- 5.4 Delegates from other parties also expressed their views on the question of citizenship and how the people in the TBVC states were deprived of it.

6. Further information on the question of citizenship in the TBVC states

It was agreed that the TBVC states and the South African Government furnish delegates of sub-committee 2 of WG 4 with the following information:

- * present laws of citizenship
- * number of people affected
- * residence of citizens
- * the number of citizens in other states
- * the number of other people in TBVC states
- * requirements for TBVC citizens and residents to become South African citizens
- * laws governing elections
- * the status of non-ethnic citizens
- * the number of people who have had their citizenship restored in each state in terms of the Citizenship Restoration Act of 1986

7. Consensus

- 7.1 Several statements were advanced as summary consensus of the deliberations. These were accepted in principle but agreement had to be reached on the wording. It was resolved that an ad hoc committee work out a final consensus statement to be ratified in the next meeting of the sub-committee 2 (of WG 4). The ANC, the South African Government and the Solidarity Party together with the chairman remained working on the statement of consensus after the sub-committee 2 had adjourned.
- 7.2 The following is the wording of the ad hoc committee on consensus:

That on the question of the citizenship of the TBVC states, consensus exists that South African citizenship be restored except where specific exclusion of citizenship is expressed. Procedures for such restoration (including the issue of testing of the will of the people, presently being considered by sub-committee 1 of WG 4) have still to be decided upon.

8. Question of substitutes

The South African Government made a submission on the question of substitutes to the sub-committee 2 of WG 4 (see Addendum B). This matter to be referred to the Steering Committee of WG 4 for its ruling.

9. **Documents circulated**

A document by the SA Government titled "The Question of Citizenship" (this was handed out at the meeting and given the size of the document, is not annexed).

10. **Closure**

The chairperson closed the meeting at 13h45


Dear Prof Marivate,
